

Vote Buying Is Charged In Road Plan

OTTAWA (CP)—New Democrat MP Frank Howard said here the federal government's decision to spend \$30,000,000 to improve trunk highways in the Atlantic provinces 'smacks of discrimination or vote buying.'

Mr. Howard, who represents the British Columbia riding of Skeena, said in a statement residents of his province and the Prairie provinces will resent the decision.

"The four Western provinces are just as urgently in need of federal highway building assistance as are the Atlantic provinces and any failure on the part of the Liberal government to recognize and act upon that need can only be construed as rank, outright discrimination," he said.

P.E.I. To Be Proposed As 'Designated Area'

OTTAWA — The naming of the entire province of Prince Edward Island as a designated area for industrial incentive purposes was proposed here last week by John Mullally, MP for Kings.

In an interview with the Ottawa bureau of The Guardian, Mr. Mullally said that if the opportunity presents itself, he intends to raise the matter during the debate on the speech from the throne at the opening of a new session his year.

"There is not a single city or area on the island that has been designated by the Department of Industry and other cities like Windsor and Brantford in Ontario have been given this classification. This is utterly ridiculous," Mr. Mullally said.

Designated area legislation provides certain tax advantages and quick write-offs for new industry establishing in such areas and some 32 such areas are currently designated in other parts of Canada.

PUZZLED
"I am puzzled at the provincial government's attitude on the proposed power cable from New Brunswick," Mr. Mullally said. "I do not believe that the cable should await the construction of the causeway. If we are to attract new industry we need an abundant source of cheap power and New Brunswick has the power to sell us. There should not be any delay on proceeding with an underwater cable."

The Kings' MP said that larger amounts would also be required to provide a good system of all weather roads in the province over and above the money that has been made available through the ADB. He said there should be an immediate start on an orderly construction of such roads with additional funds being made available through the Trans-Canada Highway agreement, roads to resources program or the ADB. He said such a network should be incorporated as part of the entire causeway-railway transportation package.

Mr. Mullally looks for three to four weeks more work on the old session when parliament convenes Feb. 16, with the pension plan, labor legislation and opting out legislation to be passed. Then a new session will start immediately, he expects.

A NEED EDUCATION AID
He said there was need of more federal aid to education, although he realizes this is a delicate and difficult area. P.E.I. has taken this matter up with industry minister C.M. Drury but I can't say I have made too much headway. I intend to raise it in the House at the first opportunity," the youthful Kings' MP said. "The island is in a serious position and in the last 10 years we had a net loss of 14,000 migrants, mostly young, well educated people."

Speculation Lesage May Join Cabinet
OTTAWA (CP)—Amid growing speculation Jean Lesage may return to federal politics, Prime Minister Pearson said the Quebec premier would do a "fine job" if he did come to Ottawa.

He's doing a fine job in Quebec and if he came back he'd do a fine job here," Mr. Pearson told a press conference. The prime minister faced a series of questions on the possibility of Mr. Lesage returning to federal politics after the Quebec premier had said he was under pressure to do so.

Did the pressure come from Mr. Pearson?
"No pressure of course," said a smiling prime minister.

At the second table, where Robert Nail and Lew Maths, playing weak two bids, were respectively North-South for the American team, the bidding went:

South West North East
2♣ 2♦ 3♣ 3♦
4♦ 4♥ 5♦ 5♣
Dble 4♠ Dble 4♠

The British West became declarer at four spades doubled and Nail made the best opening lead of a trump. Declarer took the spade in dummy with the queen and led the jack of diamonds.

South won with the ace and returned the nine of hearts. The queen lost to the king and North played another trump. Declarer took the spade in dummy and played a heart, allowing South to win the trick after South showed out.

North shifted to the king of clubs, and while declarer was able to ruff a heart and a diamond in dummy, he eventually lost another diamond trick to go down one — 100 points.

So the United States team gained 800 points on the deal as a result of good defense at both tables.

Opening lead—ace of hearts. This fascinating hand occurred in the match between Great Britain and the United States during the world championship played in New York in 1962.

At the first table, where the British held the North-South cards, South became declarer as five diamonds doubled. West (Eric Murray) led the ace of hearts and then shifted to the three of spades!

When East (Charles Coon) won the trick with the jack, he realized that Murray — by underleading the A-K — was angling for a ruff. It was not difficult to figure out that West was

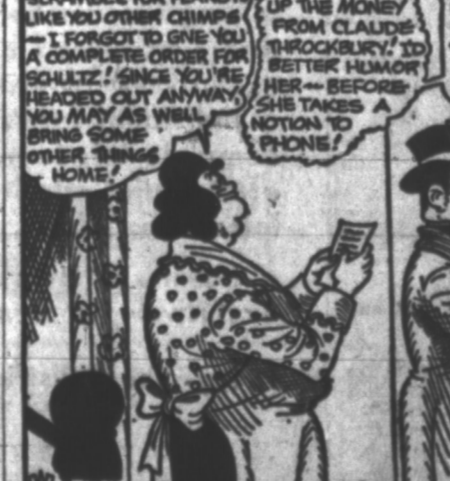
