

**Anglicans Urged
To Expand Role
In School Work**

LENNOXVILLE, Que. (CP)—The Anglican Church of Canada was urged Tuesday to expand its role in connection with Eskimo and Indian residential schools because their students graduate only to face virtual rejection by their own people and discrimination from other Canadians.

Rev. Trevor E. Jones, director of residential schools and hostels, told the executive council of the church 50 per cent of Eskimo and Indian students become drifters after graduation because of this non-acceptance. Canon Jones made the remarks in a report to some 200 clerical and lay delegates on the second day of the council's four-day meeting at Bishop's University in this Eastern Township community.

He said the schools, operated by the Anglican Church and financed by the federal government, are in many respects becoming "correctional" institutions because of the unexpected attitude the students face when they return to their homes or try for jobs.

Rev. M. C. Robinson, personnel secretary of the department of missions, earlier said the church's task of recruiting missionaries for work overseas is being hampered by "mistaken attitudes regarding the image of a missionary."

Canon Robinson of Toronto, said an attitude has developed that missionaries are no longer necessary and their methods are outdated.
