

# Federal Cabinet To Consider Hate Literature, Sterilization

OTTAWA (CP)—The federal cabinet will go into the question of hate literature, genocide and mass sterilization next week as it studies possible ways to curb racist propaganda, Prime Minister Pearson said.

However, he told a delegation from the Canadian Jewish Congress that it is doubtful whether legislation on hate literature can be placed before Parliament at its current session.

Mr. Pearson and seven of his cabinet ministers received a brief from the congress renewing pressure for legislative action on hate literature.

He said a report by government officials on possible legislative steps comes before the cabinet next week.

Saul Hayes, congress executive vice-president, urged that at the same time the cabinet consider whether legislation can be passed to implement fully the UN convention on genocide.

While murder is outlawed by Canada law, such aspects of genocide as mass sterilization and mass castrations which would achieve extermination of a race within a generation are left untouched. Nor is advocacy of such steps outlawed.

**WILL STUDY ISSUE**

Mr. Pearson said these matters will come up in the cabinet study of hate literature and also when Canada decides whether to sign the UN convention against racial discrimination.

He also wanted to have the provincial governments associated with any steps the federal government takes in these areas and hoped to have discussions with them.

The congress also complained in a brief that the references to the "equal partnership of the founding races" in Canada perpetuates outmoded and dangerous racial notions.

Mr. Pearson acknowledged that the cabinet might have chosen a "more fortunate" wording in drawing up the terms of reference. The matter had been discussed with the commission and efforts had been made by him and the commission to modify the impression given.

The commission's report, which he hoped would be available by the year end, would overshadow the wording in the terms of reference and he hoped the commission would interpret its instructions so as to remove the objectionable effect.

**EXPRESSES FEAR**

The congress also expressed fear that immigration policy may be changed to curtail the number of relatives of Canadian residents who may be sponsored for immigration to this country.

Mr. Pearson said this has been under cabinet discussion and something will be placed before Parliament soon. It was not the intention to "unwisely restrict immigration" but he said the government did not want to high a proportion of total immigration to come from sponsored groups.

The government was urged by the congress to sign the UN convention to outlaw racial discrimination and implement it in Canada.

Mr. Pearson said it would be possible for Canada to sign the convention and discuss later with the provinces ways to implement its provisions in the country.

# CONTRACT BRIDGE

East dealer. East-West vulnerable.

The bidding:  
East South West North  
1♣ Dble 1♠ 2♦  
Pass 2NT

Opening lead—queen of spades.

Here is a well-defended hand. South got to two trump and West led the queen of spades. East took it with the ace and led back the king of hearts.

With this play, South would have had no trouble making the contract. Thus, let's suppose that East had made the more prosaic return of a club.

In that case South would win the club with the ace and establish four diamond tricks by leading the king and then the ten (overtaking with the jack) to force out the ace. He would make eight tricks consisting of a spade, a heart, four diamonds and two clubs.

The extraordinary heart return in effect pulled the rug out from under declarer's feet. It gave South an extra heart trick he would ordinarily not have made, but at the same time it prevented him from enjoying dummy's diamonds.

Declarer took the heart with the ace and played a low diamond to the king. West playing the three, and continued with the ten of diamonds to the Jack. West playing the four.

If East had made the mistake of refusing the jack, South would have had eight ready-made tricks; but East took the jack with the ace and declarer then found it impossible to score more than seven tricks.

West's play of the three followed by the four indicated he had at least one more diamond, and thus made it easy for East to take the jack without worrying whether South had the missing diamond.

Had West been dealt only the 4-3 of diamonds, he would have played the four and then the three to show a doubleton. In such case, East would have ducked the jack, knowing that South had the missing eight.

However, the really dramatic play of the hand was East's return of the king of hearts, which signified a complete willingness to throw away a trick in an attempt to nullify dummy's diamonds.

# Food Output Outstripped By Babies

ROME (AP)—World food production apparently failed to keep up with population growth last year and the prospect for this year is no better, the United Nations Food and Agricultural Organization has reported.

"Neither food nor raw materials taken separately are likely to have advanced in step with population growth," said the organization's annual commodity review, based on information to the middle of March.

If final figures available later show a production increase in 1965, it will be small, the report said. Production for 1965-66 was unlikely to sustain the population growth rate of two per cent.

The group noted that vital crops of wheat and rice were down, with only a slight increase in coarse grains.
