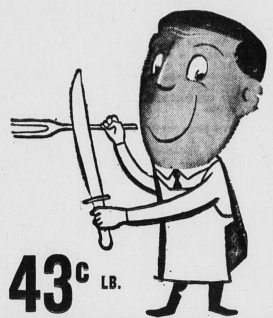

Dominion Bridge Profits Decline

MONTREAL (CP) — Dominion Bridge Co. Ltd. Wednesday reported net profit of \$1,706,271 or 56 cents a share for the year ended Dec. 31, 1962, compared with \$2,139,331 or 83 cents a share for the same period of 1961.

Sales were \$104,700,333 compared with \$83,983,408 last year, while earnings from operations were \$1,206,907 compared with \$1,153,416 in 1961.

H. C. Welford, president said "the prices at which work has had to be taken to keep plants operating combined with a lower than normal volume of business available adversely affected the company's earnings."

Mr. Welford added market prices for fabricated structural steel, while improved, are "still at an unsatisfactory level."

However, he said steps have been taken to reduce expenses and to minimize the use of working capital in order to meet highly competitive market conditions.

MERMAID OUT AS SHOP SIGN

VANCOUVER (CP) — A mermaid on a rock in the harbor of Copenhagen may be fine for Copenhagen, but a painted replica is too much physically for Vancouver.

City electrician L. F. Ryan has turned down a bid by the Little Mermaid Coffee Shop to use the pathetic little heroine of a Hans Christian Andersen fairy tale on an electric sign.

Except for strands of swirling seaweed, mermaids are traditionally nude from the navel up.

"City bylaws," Ryan said, "do not allow the naked female form to appear on signs."

Mrs. Elsa Christensen, proprietor of the coffee shop and a Copenhagen resident for 40 years, said she will appeal the decision.

"She's only 14 years old in the story—it's just like calling the little mermaid a tramp."

CNR Agreement On Seniority Said Reached

MONTREAL (CP) — Agreement has been reached between the CNR and the Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employes (CMW) about extending the revision of seniority rights, it was reported Wednesday.

The agreement, to be signed today, covers about 14,000 workers.

The new plan will allow maintenance of way workers to apply seniority rights over a wider geographical area.

The wider application of seniority rights will mean greater job security for workers, a railway spokesman said.

The Brotherhood is the second major union to revise seniority terms with the CNR. Last year the Canadian Brotherhood of Railway, Transport and General Workers (CLC) signed a new contract covering about 22,000 workers.

The CNR also is negotiating seniority revisions with a number of other unions.

Japan Expected To Ask Revision Of Seal Treaty

TOKYO (AP) — Japan is expected to press for revision of the four-power seal agreement to permit sealing on the open seas, it was reported Wednesday.

The seal treaty involves Canada, Russia, United States and Japan and was signed in 1957. It expires in October and a conference of the four countries is scheduled next month to consider the pact.

The treaty prohibits seal catching on the open seas. Sealing operations on land are allowed by the United States and the Soviet Union—two countries where seals breed.

Seals breed on the American island of Pribilof and the Russian islands of Commander and Robben in the north Pacific.

The Japan Fisheries Association said conservation measures under the treaty have greatly boosted the seal population and there is need for pelagic sealing.

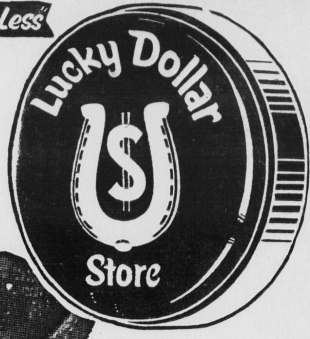
The present supply of fur seals comes from Russia and the United States. The two countries, under the treaty, must each divert 15 per cent of their catch to Canada and Japan.

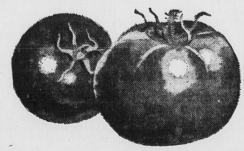

4 Carrots' Sliced' . . . 3 Onions 'Sliced'

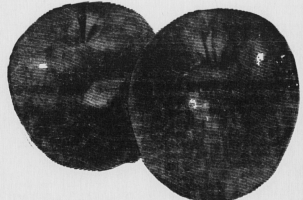

(Piece cheese cloth, boil 4-6 hrs.). Strain and add 2 tbsps. flour to thicken, then boil for 10 mins. longer.
