These awards will support Prince Edward Island nurses who are conducting research on nursing care issues and building nursing research capacity. Priority will therefore be given to research that is practice-based or that will provide the background for future practice-based studies. The NCP Program does not fund health system research.

Deadlines for receipt of applications for these awards are April 25, 2005 and July 1, 2005.

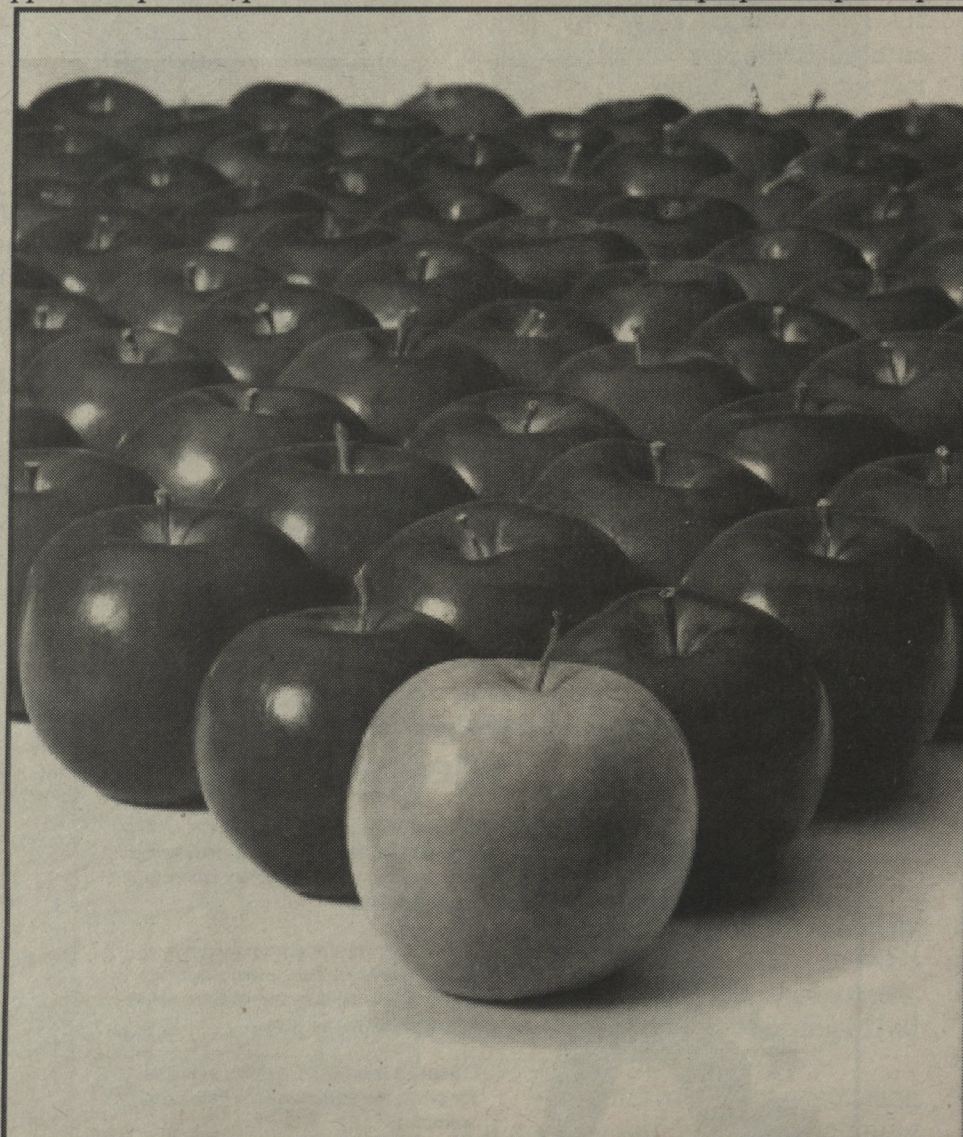
