A BICYCLE BUILT FOR A COUPLE.

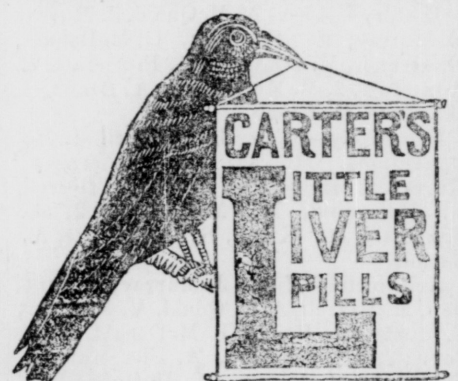
