

NEWS BY TELEGRAPH.

EUROPEAN.

LONDON, Sept. 29.

The "Times" leading editorial says: If France draws back from giving reality to the demonstration, the concert of the powers is, for the present, at an end. The ridicule of having sailed to Gravosa for the purpose of sailing back again will attach in the first instance to France, but other powers must take their share of it. They have been misled by France, and thus being induced to commit themselves to a game of brag which has not succeeded, and which could not have been expected to succeed. Even a weaker power than Turkey might safely venture to snap her fingers at the demonstration which is on no account to bite.

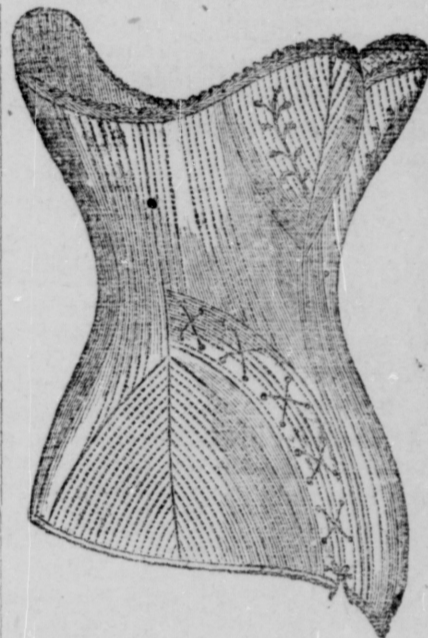
