Find No Clue To Mystery Girl

BRANTFORD, Ont., June 13 — (CP) — Police decided today they were getting nowhere in a search for the "mystery girl" whose fleeting appearances gave rise to hopes that she might be a missing 19-year-old bookkeeper.

Sgt. Jack Whitty of the Ontario Provincial Police called off the hunt. Volunteers, however, continued to search the swamp-dotted farmland near Mount Pleasant, five miles south of here.

Albert McAlister, a farmer who caught a glimpse of the girl yesterday morning, said he is sure she is Mabel Crumback, who disappeared early May 28 from her home in a Toronto suburb.

But police said that McAlister's description of the girl does not tally with the official police description of the Crumback girl.

A variety of clues — footprints, the ashes of a fire, crushed patches in a wheatfield — indicated someone is hiding in the Mount Pleasant farm-and-bush district.

Sgt. Whitty, who pressed an airplane, horses and cruiser cars into the one-day police search, said today the area is so large and the swamp and push so thick that the girl might be found only by accident.

Reports Business Looking Good

SAINT JOHN, N. B., June 13 — (CP) — "Business in general looks far better for the rest of the year than it did 12 months ago and we should feel pretty good about the economic climate," Saint John-born Nathan C. Cummings, Chicago, said in an interview here today.

Mr. Cummings is chairman of the board of Consolidated Grocers' Corporation and leader of the grocery industry in the United States.

A year ago, he said, "our economic system was in the throes of a readjustment period that kept the prophets of doom shaking their heads over the future."

Referring to the grocery trade, Mr. Cummings expressed opinion that "we must change our concept of selling to the retailer. No longer can we consider that our salesmen have done a good job if they merely load a retailer."

More retailers were advertising than three years ago, "but the gap between what is being done and what should be done is terrific, to say the least. I think it is a fair conclusion that the surface has only been scratched in showing these retailers how to reach and sell their customers."

Demands New Deal For English Villages

LONDON, July 13 — (Reuters) — About 4,000 British women came to London from the countryside today to demand a "new deal" for the English village—everything, in fact, from new sewers to the extermination of midges.

Representing more than 7,000 Women's Institutes in the hamlets of England and Wales, they crowded London's vast Albert Hall in an annual meeting of their National Federation, to plead for improved conditions in their communities and maintenance of the traditional pattern of British country life.

A survey conducted by the National Federation in nearly 7,000 villages showed that the overwhelming need of most villages was for "improved sewerage or indeed for sewerage of any kind."

One village, Tushingham in Cheshire, with a population of 500, was reported to be without sewerage, a village hall or telephones.

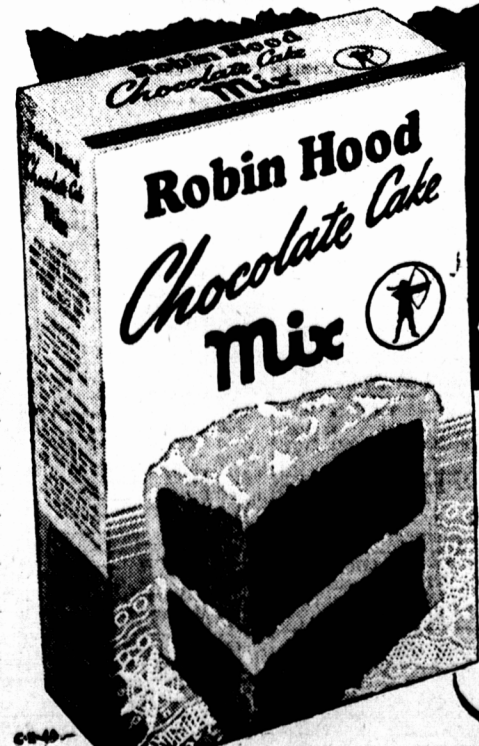
