NEW BONESLASH TURKEY.—It is said that calves two or three days old are killed in considerable numbers at Campbellton, near Kingston, Ontario, and the carcasses sent to Montreal to be made into boneslashed turkey. As many as fifty calves were killed in one day recently.

THE HORSE BUSINESS.—An exchange says: Never has horse-flesh been so cheap in the Boston market as at present. The latest quotations are as follows: For light horses, \$75; for common horses \$110; for medium business chucks, weighing 1,100 pounds, \$90 to \$125. A better class of round, smooth horses with some style and action bring from \$125 to \$150. Heavy, well-shaped Percherons, weighing between 14 and 17 cwt., sell from \$145 to \$180.

THE BAIT ACT.—A St. John's, Nfld., despatch says the bait act of last year cost the colony \$20,000 more than in 1889, and that "as no fees were exacted from Americans, and the Canadians were prevented from coming to our shores for bait, we lost in license fees and light dues a sum of fully \$20,000, which would have been contributed to the revenue of the colony. Beside the loss to the revenue, there has been a loss to the people of more than \$80,000 that they would have obtained from the sales of their bait and ice. At the lowest it is a total loss to the colony of from \$120,000 to \$200,000."
