WAR NEWS.

Turkey's Heavy Conditions.

£10,000,000 STG AFD. CESSION OF THESSALY.

Grave International Crisis.

CONSTANTINOPLE, May 17.—The Porte has replied officially to the joint note of the Powers and declines to agree to an armistice until the following conditions are accepted: (1) Annexation of Thessaly; (2) an indemnity of ten million pounds; and (3) abolition of the capitulations.

The Porte proposes that the plenipotentiaries of the powers should meet at Pharsalos to discuss the terms of peace, and declares that if these conditions are declined the Turkish army will continue to advance. The demand for the annexation of Thessaly is based upon the fact that the province was originally ceded to Greece on the advice of the powers with the object of ending brigandage and Greek incursions into Ottoman territory, the Porte believing at the time that the cession would obtain these objects, but the recent incursions of Greek bands and the events immediately preceding the present war have proved the contrary.

The ambassadors met on Saturday to consider the Porte's answer which is regarded as raising an extremely grave issue. It is believed that a representation will be made to the Sultan personally to induce a modification of these terms. But it is foreseen that this will be very difficult owing to the attitude of the powerful old Turkish war party.

If the Porte should prove obdurate an European conference is not improbable. It is not regarded as quite certain that the Powers will not consent to the retrocession of Thessaly.

NOTES FROM THE CAPITAL.

The Plebiscite Bill.

Two Questions to be Asked.

OTTAWA, May 17.—It is announced that Hon. Mr. Fisher will introduce the plebiscite bill into the House of Commons perhaps towards the end of the present week.

The proposal to submit the complete bill to the people, which if carried would thereby become law, will not be acted on. But the bill will simply empower the government to submit two questions: 1st, "Are you in favor of total prohibition of the liquor traffic?" and 2nd, "Are you in favor of prohibition if it involves direct taxation to make up the consequent deficit in the revenue?" As already stated, the loss to the revenue would be seven millions of dollars. The idea seems to find favor with the government that to take a vote at the municipal elections would avoid the expense of about \$200,000 attendant on taking a separate vote. It is said that the Government do not regard the time of taking the vote as an essential feature of the bill.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

WINNIPEG, May 15.—The Northern Pacific railway crop bulletin shows the wheat to be all in, and promises of an abundant yield are plentiful.

LONDON, May 15.—The Constantinople correspondent of the Daily Telegraph says: "The Sultan, acting upon the advice of Emperor William, has declared to M. Cambon, the French ambassador, that he cannot agree to granting an armistice until the basis of peace has been decided upon and approved of him."

ST. PETERSBURG, May 14.—A terrible railway disaster befell a military train on Friday evening between Rokenhof and Eliva on the Valki Jurjev line. Sixteen cars were smashed. Two officers and nearly one hundred soldiers were killed and sixty others seriously wounded.

MONTREAL, May 14.—The board of trade today discussed the question of the quantity of Canadian wheat being shipped from American ports via Buffalo at present. The complaint is that the facilities at Montreal are not equal to the demand made upon them.

LIMA, Peru, May 14.—Emilio Clark, the United States consular agent at Piura, has published a statement in the newspapers to the effect that his office has been sacked and important documents, money and other valuables stolen. The prefect of police denies this and says that the only seizure was of the furniture.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 14.—Mrs. Langtry, the English actress, is a single woman. The superior court of Lake county, California, where she has her legal home, has granted her a divorce. There was no contest. The case of the plaintiff was presented on depositions taken in London in which desertion was alleged. After considering the case a few hours, the judge granted the decree sought.

ST. JOHN, N.F., May 14.—A serious encounter has taken place at Fortune Bay between a band of smugglers and the crew of the revenue cruiser Fiona. The revenue officers endeavored to arrest the smugglers for carrying venison to St. Pierre. The smugglers resisted and succeeded in driving off the officers. Reinforcements are being sent by the revenue authorities, as it is feared that the disturbance may assume serious proportions.

ST. PETERSBURG, May 15.—Following upon the intimation that Russia would not be opposed to the ministeration of Thessaly by Turkey, it became known, semi-officially, last evening, that the diplomats are greatly concerned at the news recently received from Bulgaria. During the past week much agitation against Turkey has been reported both among the people of Bulgaria and the Bulgarian army, and fears are expressed that the popular feeling thus aroused may force the hands of the government of Bulgaria.

PARIS, May 14.—Tom Mann, the English labor leader and agitator, has been in Paris since Monday, agitating the organization of trades unions, and a large meeting was arranged for tonight, at which he was announced to deliver an address. This morning Mann was notified by the police that he would not be allowed to speak tonight, and furthermore, that he must quit the country within twenty-four hours, or suffer the consequences of his failure to do so. Mann will return to London immediately.
