## KEEP IN TRIM

### Exercise Will Keep You Very Supple And Young

Beautiful body movements can help you to stay forever young! On the surface that statement might seem to be a whopping exaggeration, but it is true. When every movement you make is done so as to use your muscles the way nature intended them to be used, then you're exercising all the while. You'll keep supple and young.

For enlightenment, test every movement done correctly. Place a chair sideways to a mirror. Now, sit down slowly, using your thigh muscles only - keep your back straight. Sit with back of hips against the chairback and pull up-and-in snugly through the middle. That position not only helps you to feel streamlined, it is streamlining. In raising from the chair, do it this way - come up one leg slightly back, come up, again using the powerful thigh muscles, keeping gentle muscles pulled up snugly and hips contracted. If you catch yourself getting out of chair by use of your arms, change that. GET RHYTHM How do you walk up stairs, with hips tucked under or trailing? The streamlining way is to put your whole foot on the step, bend your knees and lift with the thigh muscles, hip in a circle contracted. Keep your back straight. In coming down, let one foot hang over the top step, bend opposite knee, keep back straight - that's it. Rethink rhythm in your movements - never move jerkily or off balance. If you tend to walk hurriedly, chin leading, you're out of balance. Get on the posture beam, lengthen your stride slightly and move smoothly. On stage the rule is to let the thigh lead and walk with toes pointed almost in a straight line. Walking with feet widely separated broadens hips. Beautiful movement can stem only from correct posture. Keep the control through the middle of your figure. And think up - up with the top of your head - shoulders at ease. In correct alignment you'll look streamlined, and you'll feel it, too.
