

Doctor Finds Security Here



—A victim of the ravages of a war-torn world Dr. L. K. Zielinski (above) who recently moved to Kensington from Kinkora where he has conducted a general practice in medicine since April 4, 1951, has at last found in Canada the security and freedom which he sought in many countries ever since the day in 1940 that he was taken prisoner in his native Poland by the Russians.

Born 40 years ago in Poland, he began medical studies in Warsaw in 1932. His final examinations were interrupted by the war which began when Russia invaded Poland.

As a Lieutenant in the Polish army he was captured and deported to Russia where for 9 months he was confined to prison before being sent to do slave labor in the Siberian forests. Here

he spent 7 months chopping trees as a member of a work-crew whose inadequate rations were issued on the basis of work done.

After Hitler declared war on Russia, Sikorski, the leader of the Polish free government in England made a military agreement with Stalin whereby Polish prisoners in Russia were released, and in 1941 Dr. Zielinski was liberated from the Russian labor-camp in Siberia.

Joining the Polish army in Russia his unit was sent to Teheran, Iran. Here he contracted malaria and until his recovery six months later was a patient in the British hospital in that city.

His health restored he re-joined the Polish army medical corps in Iraq, and was sent to Palestine. From here he was posted to Beirut, Lebanon, where he obtained his degree of "doctor of medicine" in December, 1945.

The following year he did post-graduate work in the 8th Military General Hospital in El-Kantara, Egypt.

In 1947 he went to England where he served as medical officer and officer-in-charge of camp reception stations with the Polish Re-Settlement Corps.

In 1949-50, following a 6-months post-graduate course at a London hospital, he continued his practice of medicine in association with two English doctors in Durham, England.

Realizing his ambitions to come to Canada he arrived in Halifax on April 1, 1951, and three days later obtained his license to practice medicine in Prince Edward Island.

Opening an office in Kinkora, he has conducted a successful practice in that area. Recently he moved to Kensington and will continue his practice in both districts.

He is a member of the Canadian and British Medical Associations, and is on the staff of Prince County Hospital in Summerside.

Dr. Zielinski is married and has three children; a daughter born in Egypt, a son born in England,

and a daughter born in Summerside, P. E. I.

Dr. Zielinski met his wife, also a native of Poland, in Beirut, Lebanon, where she was a student of political science at the French University.

JAMES CAGNEY COMES TO CAPITOL, SUMMERSIDE IN POWERFUL DRAMA

College Professor Will Address PEI Teachers

MONTREAL, (CP) — Prof. David Munroe of Macdonald college, will address the Prince Edward Island teachers' convention, at Charlottetown next week as part of an over-all program of making known the needs and opportunities of the teaching profession.

Prof. Munroe, director of the school for teachers at Macdonald, said today the college will be called upon to train 300 to 400 teachers, compared to the present enrolment of 220, if the current serious shortage of teachers is to be eliminated. Enrolment had increased by 100 in the last five years.
