Ralph Annear and David MacLean were winners of the Safe Driving Teenage Road-e-o which was sponsored by the Montague Junior Board of Trade, and held at the Beaver Club grounds Wednesday afternoon.

Previous to the driving skill test a written test was given at the high school under the supervision of Gilbert Clements.

The winner and runner-up of the Maritime Road-e-o will receive an expense free air trip to Ottawa to compete in the National finals with scholarships of first \$1,000.00, second \$500.00, third \$150.00.

A large crowd was present to watch the eighteen contestants compete in the driving skill test which was composed of four courses.

Of the eighteen contestants only one young lady, Miss Eileen Orwell participated.

The junior board feels that this has been a very worthwhile project and is looking forward to sponsoring a yearly teenage Road-e-o.

1. Straight line test - driving between five pair of balls placed eleven and a half inches apart, forward and reverse along a one hundred foot course. Judges were Ken Norris, Cyrus Shaw, and Archie Hickey.

2. Serpentine - consisting of maneuvering a car forward and backward around barrels in a limited space. Judges were, Basil Johnston, Peter Sinclair, and J. J. Stewart.

3. Stopping smoothly - in this test the contestant was required to drive 20 m.p.h. and then stop smoothly at a given point. Judges were, Rev. P.A. Campbell and B.K. Clements.

4. Parallel parking - backing into a parking space with a minimum of movement. Judges were, C.R. Boehner, Douglas MacGowan, and Cecil Beck.

The two winners from Montague will be presented with jackets and have the privilege of representing Montague in the Maritime finals.

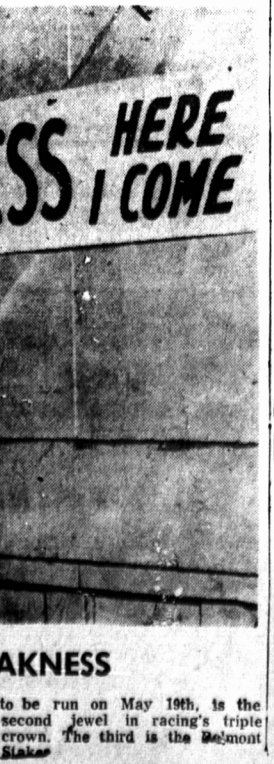
