# Campaign Ends In Big Hush Of Expectancy

Getting in last licks Prime Minister St. Laurent and John Diefenbaker, with deadly purpose, clanged swords at close range in Ontario Thursday. They crossed paths twice. Although they did not meet, each knew afterwards that the other had been there.

But the activity was purposeful in all corners of the campaign arena. CCF Leader Mr. J. Coldwell and Social Credit Leader Solon Low fenced in their own constituencies. Cabinet Ministers, interested premiers and others also busied themselves in closing battle.

At meetings in Stratford and Woodstock, Mr. St. Laurent said Progressive Conservative Leader Diefenbaker showed a lack of public responsibility in making "wild and rash" charges that Canadians could lose their individual rights if the Liberals were returned to power Monday.

That was the "rankest, most irresponsible tommyrot propaganda I have ever heard," said the Liberal leader. No man with a shred of responsibility to the public should make wild statements of that kind.

PC LEADER'S VIEW  
"The varnish of caress is coming off," said Mrs. Diefenbaker as he followed Mr. St. Laurent into Stratford and Woodstock. "But the madder he gets, the better I like it. It's evidence that he has seen the change."

prosperous, Mr. Diefenbaker, in an evident reference to the prime minister's first name, added: "and if that word rhymes with a certain name, it's not my fault." Meantime, Mr. Coldwell proposed establishment of a national land and water authority to plan "a bold and imaginative program of resource development and conservation in Canada."

Winding up his campaign with a tour of his Saskatchewan constituency of Rosetown-Biggar, Mr. Coldwell told a Kenaston meeting conservation problems are beyond financial capacity of most provinces.

"The development and conservation of resources clearly requires national co-ordination, planning and assistance." Yet the Liberal government for years had refused to call a federal-provincial conference on the subject.

While Mr. Low attended to last-minute details in his Northern Alberta constituency of Peace River, Social Credit Premier Bennett of British Columbia told a Regina press conference he had no ambition to be premier.

There is "the best of feeling" among him, Mr. Low and Alberta's Social Credit Premier Manning, he said. There was no truth to rumors of a rift within the party.

Those rumors arose from a "smear campaign" by other political parties, he said. "The old line parties are trying to smear us because they haven't the courage to answer the things we are doing in B.C. and Alberta."

Mr. Diefenbaker said at Brantford that the prime minister in recent days had adopted a new and critical attitude. He was "indulging in personalities which many feel are out of place." This was a contrast to his previous "caress, cuddle and coo" attitude.

It was understandable, the Liberals believed they were indispensable "and they don't know what is happening in this country today. They are speaking in the desperation of necessity."

VOICES HOPE  
Appearing at Woodstock and Stratford behind the prime minister, Mr. Diefenbaker said: "I've followed him into two places today and I hope soon to follow him into a third one the prime ministry."

In a recorded radio speech, Mr. Coldwell forecast a "bright future" for CCF members who were elected. The largest CCF group—29—was elected in 1945. In 1953, the CCF won 23 seats.

He added that while the Liberals and Conservatives contend to fight

each other "they have in effect entered into a conspiracy to cooperate against the CCF" by telling voters if they can't vote for one of the old-line parties, they should vote for the other.

Asked how Social Credit would vote if no party gets a clear majority Monday, Premier Bennett said his party will support the group with the largest number of seats as long as its policies are "good for Canada."

"We will not form any coalition or collusion. We'll just vote for policies that are good for Canada—those are Social Credit policies."

HEES MAKES PROMISE  
Elsewhere:  
George Hees, former president of the national PC Association seeking re-election in Toronto, said in a radio broadcast the Conservatives, if elected, will remove credit restrictions.

Also on radio, Fisheries Minister Sinclair said Canadians still remember the last Conservative federal government of the depression years too well to change from the Liberals now. "A change to what? 'Back to the Tories?'"

Ontario CCF leader Donald Macdonald told a Toronto meeting of the Conservatives' old age pension record "is the sorriest of all." They had opposed the pension when the Liberals introduced them in 1927 under pressure from the late J. S. Woodsworth, first CCF party leader.

At Andover, N.B., Conservative Premier Fleming said he does not consider the cost of power a secondary consideration "in New Brunswick under the federal offer to build steam power plants in that province and Nova Scotia. It suggested Labor Minister Gregg has said the detail of power cost is a secondary consideration."

Conservative Donald Fleming, Transport Minister Marler said in a radio broadcast the "change" proposed by the Conservatives "could be a change for the worse." Where, he asked, would the Conservatives get the cabinet material the Liberals have?

Conservative Donald Fleming, Minister of Eglington, said in a radio speech the issue of whether Canada wants to return to a free Parliament "transcends all others" in this election campaign.

In a radio speech from Montreal, Privy Council Minister Cheyette said Mr. Diefenbaker is "promising to tamper with Canada's social security program."

Leon Balcer, president of the national PC Association seeking re-election in Trois-Rivieres, Que., said his party will be elected to government Monday.
