New Dems say Old Parties In P.E.I. 'Getting Desperate'

It appears that the two old parties on the island are getting desperate. Ian Webster, P.E.I. president of the New Democratic Party told a group of supporters in Charlottetown last night. Mr. Webster says this desperation is showing up in two ways. First, the importing of so many party brass to try and keep pressure voters into supporting them. Never before in a general election, Mr. Webster said, had the island vote appeared so important. Secondly, he said, a smear and rumor campaign has been started to try and discredit the New Democrats. This is the worst form of campaigning and is no credit to those responsible for it, he added.

Mr. Webster says that his party does not have the funds or the desire to conduct a high pressure campaign. He says that the New Democratic candidates have been speaking for themselves and are making an excellent job of explaining their platform and principles. He says "I am satisfied that our island people are intelligent enough to think and decide for themselves."
