

French Finances.

PARIS, Sept 15.—The French budget for 1900 shows an increase in the estimated expenditure of 45,000,000 francs (\$9,000,000). The war and marine ministers ask for 36,000,000 (\$7,200,000) for the supplementary force in Algiers, and the building of new warships. The national debt amounts to thirty milliards (\$6,000,000,000).

The Apple Crop.

HALIFAX, Sept 17.—Reports from the apple raising region of Nova Scotia indicate a fine crop, that will reach not less than 500,000 barrels. A recent apple circular from W. Dennis and Sons, London, says the English crop is generally considered to be a moderate one, and although some districts look like having a fair supply, it may be regarded as being distinctly under the average.
