Fire, Explosion Racks Souris-Based Dragger

The Souris-based dragger, Harry G. owned and captained by Raymond Griffin of Montague, burned and exploded Wednesday night in Pictou Harbor where she arrived earlier the same day for engine repairs.

None of the five men aboard were injured in the blaze which broke out about 8:30 p.m. but the 38-ton vessel and 200-ton cargo of fish valued at \$47,000 was considered a total loss.

Eugene Gorman, deputy minister of fisheries and chairman of fisheries loan board is expected back in the province today following a visit to the scene. Francis Campbell, loan board inspector is accompanying him.

Pictou firemen filled the boat with water to control the fire. Another boat towed the Harry G. away from the pier with the

idea of beaching her in a safer part of the harbor.

While she was being towed two men still aboard yelled, "she's afloat again." As the blaze spread a second time the men had to be taken off but the tow continued.

Finally they anchored the burning craft in shallow water. A muffled explosion shook the Harry G. about midnight, apparently caused by fire reaching 1,200 gallons of fuel oil in her tanks.

At one time it was feared the boat might drift into a C.N.R. trestle across the West River near Pictou. The fire still smoldered today.

Besides Capt. Griffin the crew was made up of mate Bud White and engineer Nat Campbell, both of Montague; cook Claude Paquet and deck hand Steve Comeau both of Souris, P. E. I.

On Sept. 6, 1957, the Harry G. skippered by Captain Griffin rescued Mr. and Mrs. Frank Johnston of Charlottetown 25 miles off East Point.

Caught in a strong Gulf current the previous day the Island trio had been adrift in a small dory for 22 hours.

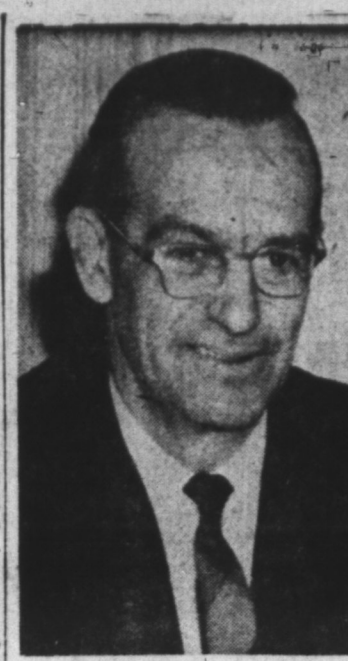
