

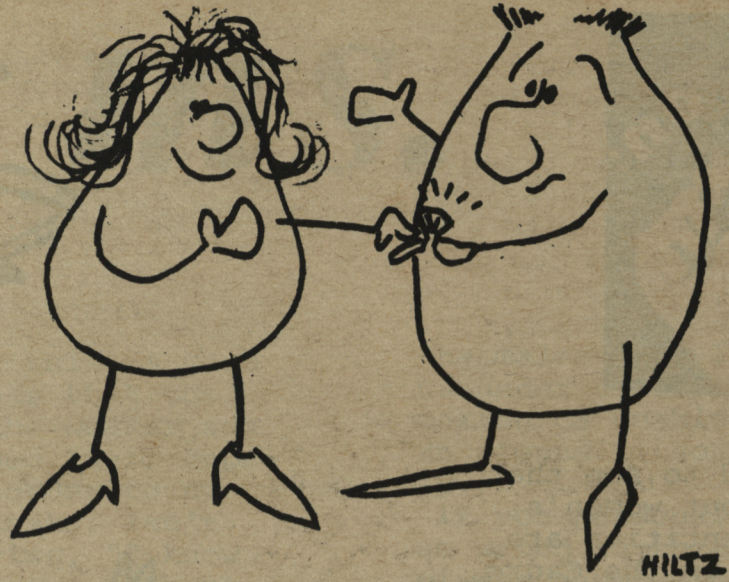

of courtesy toward someone who is physically incapable then I agree with you whole heartedly. However, I feel that many of the so called courtesies are done for other motives.

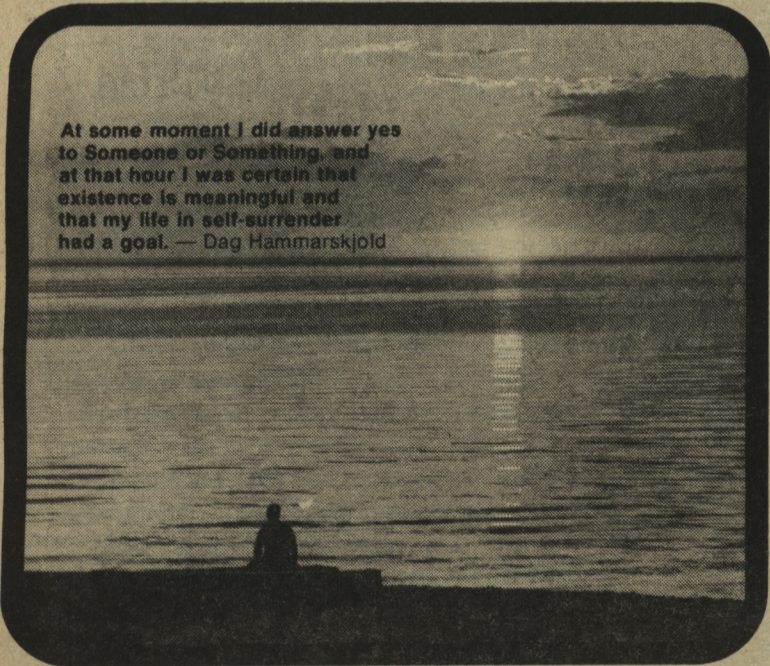
