# 43 Bills Receive Royal Assent As '65 P.E.I. Legislature Closes

Forty-three bills received Royal Assent from Lieutenant-Governor W. J. MacDonald yesterday morning, and the 1965 session of the Prince Edward Island Legislature came to a close.

Prior to His Honor's arrival, legislators gave third reading to six bills and approved the report of the contingent accounts committee.

Before entering the legislative building, the Lieutenant-Governor inspected a guard of honor composed of Island military units and attended by the band of the P.E.I. Regiment.

Following prorogation, the guard staged a march past for His Honor.

Ushered into the assembly chamber by Sergeant-at-Arms Samuel Condon, the Lieutenant-Governor was attended by his aides.

Alban Farmer, one Conservative member and two members of the opposition were all that took part in the debate before it was closed.

The budget contained estimates for record expenditures of about \$41,000,000 in the 1965-66 fiscal year and the debt of the province's consolidated fund is expected to increase by about \$7,000,000 in the next fiscal year.

The session, as a result of Feb. 9 byelections, saw an increase in the Liberal opposition. Two new members were elected, increasing the opposition to 13 in the 30-seat assembly.

Changes in the Liberal party were announced with A.W. Matheson, former opposition leader, saying he had resigned, as provincial Liberal leader. He was succeeded as opposition leader by Dr. M.L. Bonnell (4th Kings).

loan board. The government demanded that specific charges be made and the resolution was later withdrawn when the House accepted the word of a minister of the Crown that there were no irregularities in the handling of public funds.

Some furor was created when the opposition demanded the resignation of Attorney General Alban Farmer, charging that he made statements unbecoming a minister of the Crown when he allegedly said the Liberal party was founded on corruption and syndicated crime.

Another resolution, approving that Canada have power to amend her own constitution, was passed with little debate.

## Reid Restaurant Case Adjourned

Mr. Justice George J. Tweedy adjourned the appeal of John Henry Reid, charged with operating a restaurant without a license, at a sitting of the Supreme Court yesterday morning. The adjournment was a result of a request by Crown Prosecutor Alan K. Scates who wished to amend the information.

It was contended the city by-law was faulty and Mr. Scates admitted it placed the onus on everyone but the owner. Allison Gillis, appearing for Mr. Reid, objected to the amendment to the information at this stage.

Regarding the by-law, he maintained that by precedent "if there is ambiguity it must be decided in favor of the individual".

Judge Tweedy suggested the Crown might be as far ahead by proceeding with a new charge before the City Magistrate. The case was adjourned to April 2.

### Two City Residents Fined \$200 Each In Liquor Case

Four residents of Charlottetown were charged with violations of the Liquor Control Act (selling liquor) on yesterday's docket at city police court.

Mrs. Clarence Dunn, and Mrs. Wesley Constable, both pleaded guilty and each was fined \$200 and costs or two months by Magistrate A. James Haslam.

Davis Enman MacNeil and Mrs. Rose Gauthier, each pleaded not guilty to the charges. The former had his case adjourned to April 2, for hearing and the latter's case was adjourned to April 1.

The case of Louis Carl Moore, Winsloe, charged with drunken driving was dismissed.

Marvin MacNeil of Milton was fined \$25 and costs for speeding and on another charge of speeding, Daniel Bruce Birt, Charlottetown, was fined \$30 and costs or 10 days.

For driving without due care and attention, Alex Philip Milton, was fined \$10 and costs or five days.

A red light violation cost James A. Lea \$10 and costs or five days.

Two drunk and incapable were charged. One accused appeared and was given a 20-day suspended sentence while the other failed to appear and was remanded to March 27th.

### TAKES 10 MINUTES

It took His Honor 10 minutes to assent to the 43 bills and when he had left the chamber, the legislators, letting off steam after their six week session threw papers and books in the air in jubilation.

While pre-session predictions were that little legislation would be introduced at the session, the reverse was true and a heavy load of bills was introduced in the dying days of the session.

Some of the major, and most interesting, pieces of legislation were the repeal of an act prohibiting the sale of margarine in the province and a new act setting regulations for the sale of the butter substitute; an act incorporating Industrial Enterprises Incorporated, a company to promote industrial development; an act setting up a provincial water authority that will have power to control pollution problems; and an act that will permit county court judges to perform marriage ceremonies.

Other major legislation was an act to set up a Lucy Maud Montgomery Foundation, a new coroner's act, new legislation to incorporate St. Dunstan's University, an act to incorporate the P.E.I. Dietetic Association, an act which puts the office of Queen's Printer in the provincial secretary's department and several acts incorporating trust companies in the province.

The session which ended Friday may go down in history as the one which had the shortest budget debate on record.

Souster, 44-year-old Toronto-born poet, is a custodian with the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce. He began writing poetry when he was 12 years old and his published titles include *Go to Sleep*, *World 1947*, *Selected Poems* (1956), *Place of Meeting* (1962) and *A local Pride* (1962). His work is noted for its colloquial style. He is director of Contact Press, a private organization devoted to publication of Canadian poetry.

Perrault, 37, a native of Montreal, practised law for two years before turning to creative writing. His first book, *Portulan*, in 1961 won the prize of the Grand Jury des Lettres Canadiennes for poetry. *Au Coeur de la Rose* was first written for the French service of the CBC in 1958 and redone for the stage for les Apprentis-Sorciers, a Montreal company which performed it in 1963.

Father Robidoux, 36, born in Sorel, Que., studied philosophy and theology in Rome and literature at Laval University in Quebec and the Sorbonne. He is a co-author of a book now being written on the French-Canadian novel of the 20th century.
