



MORELL TO HAVE NEW HIGH SCHOOL

The contract has been let for the erection of the Morell High School on which construction work is scheduled to begin on June 15, with a view to having the building complete and ready for occupation when the school term opens in September.

The building which will be erected in a two-acre area on the Creamer Road in Morell village, provides for three class rooms, a laboratory, lunch room, Home Economics Dept. library, teachers room and an additional spacious room in the basement. Modern lighting and heating will be installed along with the necessary washroom facilities.

Occupying a ground space 93 by 57, facing South, ample provision will be provided for recreational activities after grading and landscaping areas have been dealt with in order to make the surroundings pleasing and attractive.

The building was designed by Keith G. Pickard of Summerside and Charlottetown, and Earl Gallant of North Rustico has been awarded the contract.

Federal Gov't Pays N.B. Potato Marketing Board

OTTAWA (CP) After a 2½-year delay because of marketing irregularities, the federal government has paid the New Brunswick Potato Marketing Board \$177,000 for certain losses to producers on the 1953 potato crop.

Advances are paid to producers under the Agricultural Products Cooperative Marketing Act. The potatoes are sold and the government makes up any difference between the advances and the sale price, if any.

The 1953 payment was held up when irregularities were discovered and a full investigation made. There were apparent cases of improper deliveries of potatoes to the board and discrepancies in quantities and destinations.

Final payment of \$177,000 to the board was disclosed Tuesday in the supplementary estimates tabled in the Commons.

Agriculture department officials said the payment is for potatoes actually handled by the board.

Montague School District Has Surplus, Meeting Is Informed

The annual meeting of the Montague School district was held Tuesday night, with 36 present. Mr. R.A. Martin acted as chairman, and George Nicholson as secretary of the meeting. The minutes of the last annual meeting were read, and by the trustees' report and financial statement. The following is a summary of this statement, read by Lester McLeod, secretary: total receipts, \$19,111.00; total expenditures, \$31,626.95; surplus, \$515.00.

The auditors' report was given by Arnold Wightman. Mr. H.J. Hyatt, school supervisor, gave a report and made suggestions as to improvements to the Memorial School, and the landscaping of the High School.

The supplements voted amounted to \$8,775.00; the bond retirement \$3,165.00 and operating expenses, \$9,335.00.

It was voted that the trustees were to proceed with the plans for painting the Memorial School and have a new coating put on its roof, and authorized to spend up to \$1,000.00 for these improvements.

Mr. G. Arnold Wightman was then reappointed auditor after which Mr. A.A. Fraser was appointed as the new trustee, replacing M. S.S. Hessian.

A discussion then followed on the need of more classrooms, Mr. Ralph Beck, a trustee, said that three more classrooms were required immediately. Although enrollment for the coming year could not be determined at the time, there was a possibility of the need of four or even more rooms, with three as a minimum. He stated that consideration should be given to the construction of a six-room addition using the same heat and water units from the present High School. The cost of construction would be approximately \$40,000.00 at the rate of \$2,500.00 per annum for twenty years to amortize.

Mr. Arnold Wightman then suggested the formation of a regional high school. Mr. Art Sullivan moved that a special meeting be called within two weeks for the purpose of having the district vote or not to vote the monies for the construction of additional classrooms space. The meeting then adjourned.

Montague Beaver Club Annual Meeting Held
