EXPENDITURES

peaked at \$5,332,253,505, in 1944. The bulky document tabled by Mr. Abbott contained only the details of proposed expenditures. In three weeks — April 8 at 8 p.m. EST — he will bring down the budget and tell just how he proposes to raise the money needed to cover the multi-billion dollar expenditures.

Prime Minister St. Laurent has already tipped Canadians that they should expect no substantial tax cuts while the world situation remains as it is.

Highlights of Estimates

Highlights in the estimates include:

1. The defence bill of \$2,106,000,000 will include \$324,000,000 in mutual aid — arms, and air training — for Atlantic Pact allies. Not included in the total was \$45,000,000 to be spent on such things as atomic energy.

2. The air force will spend \$759,000,000 or nearly as much as the \$800,000,000 the army and navy will spend between them.

3. Civil defence will jump 50 per cent, to \$6,508,000 from \$4,196,000 but will still be considerably less than one per cent of the total defence outlay.

4. Non-defence spending will run to \$2,249,796,809 compared to \$2,002,587,837 this year.

5. The increase was accounted for by the old-age security program, inaugurated Jan. 1 last, under which \$40 a month is paid to all 70 and over regardless of means. The program, expected to cost \$322,000,000 in 1952-53, helped to boost expenditures of the health department to \$727,390,400 from \$474,929,523.

6. The Veterans Department, largely due to increased pensions, is up again for the first time in several years, standing at \$228,000,000 against \$213,000,000.

Mr. Abbott, in a statement issued to the press, said the "gathering momentum" of the defence program is the main reason for his record prophecy.

Some expenditures on atomic energy, a field the government has tried to keep divorced from the defence program, might be considered defence expenditures. Other Atlantic Pact countries attribute some of their atomic spending to defence and Canada is following suit.

The Defence Research Board, the scientific arm of the defence department, boomed upward to \$42,000,000 from \$32,500,000, a hoist of one-third.

The air force is going up to \$759,000,000 from \$672,000,000, the army to \$532,000,000 from \$459,000,000, the navy to \$268,000,000 from \$236,000,000. Bulking large in all three were new equipment, new planes, warships, tanks and other arms.
