

Modern Meat Smoking

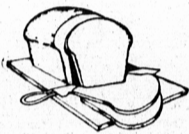

THE BRITISH LIBERAL PROGRAM.

The program of the new Imperial Ministry as foreshadowed in the King's speech is much too large to be disposed of in a single session. In fact any one of the leading topics may occupy a full session or longer. Some form of Home Rule for Ireland, the new constitution for the Transvaal with the abolition of Chinese labor, a new Education Bill, are among the questions which must necessarily call forth prolonged debate in the Commons and may produce a deadlock with the House of Lords.

Again, whichever of these important measures is first taken up will almost necessarily involve the postponement of the others until it is first disposed of. The Education Bill may perhaps claim precedence, as the large Nonconformist vote which at the election was thrown almost entirely on the Liberal side will demand for it the early attention of Parliament. It will involve many difficulties, as it must necessarily cover much controverted ground involving also much complication of detail.

No one knows what the precise nature of the Education Bill will be and still greater mystery attaches to the measure of amelioration for Ireland. But there is much impatience among the Irish representatives and people to learn what is proposed to be done on their behalf, and a strong disposition to urge this question to the front. We know what happened in Mr. Gladstone's time on this question. Two widely different measures were proposed at successive dates and after prolonged and bitter campaigns both ended in failure.

Even the new constitution for the Transvaal is beset with difficulties. The loyal English-speaking population are in no way in favor of giving full powers of self-government to those who were so recently at war with Britain. The rich mining corporations are alarmed at the prospect of coming again at least partially under Boer control, and the Blacks cannot understand or have much respect for a Government which conquered the Boers at so great cost of blood and treasure, and now proposes to hand over to these recent rebels the full control of country.

It will be impossible to satisfy both the Dutch and English speaking populations of the Transvaal as it will be impossible to satisfy the Irish and English populations in the United Kingdom by any measure of Home Rule that can be devised. Most likely any measure at all satisfactory on one side would incur the bitter opposition of the other while a compromise would leave both dissatisfied. It is, we think highly probable that the

leading features of the ministerial program cannot be finally disposed of without setting on foot a process of disintegration if not possibly of disruption in the rather cumbersome majority now following the lead of the Liberal Ministry.
