Senator Kennedy Describes Plane Crash At Conference

BOSTON (AP)—Senator Edward M. Kennedy described the plane crash in which his back was broken four months ago Monday as "just like a toboggan ride along the tops of trees."

Kennedy, Democratic junior senator from Massachusetts and younger brother of the late president John F. Kennedy, described the crash at his first press conference since the June 19 accident in western Massachusetts.

The plot of the plane and a Kennedy aide were killed. Kennedy said the rear of the plane facing the seat behind the pilot facing the rear of the plane.

"When we started to land I loosened my seat belt and turned," he said. Kennedy said he watched the altimeter reading descent from 1,000 down to 600 feet.

"All we could see was fog," he said. "Just as we reached 600 we broke out of the fog and I could see trees."

"It was apparent to me that we were going to crash... I pulled my seat belt tight. I was conscious of the impact and of sliding along the ground. Then there was nothing but silence."

Kennedy was interviewed while strapped in the orthopedic frame to which he has been confined since the accident.
