N.Y. Stock Prices Down Last Week

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market declined last week for the first time in four weeks.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was off \$2.30 to \$162.70.

Wall Street chartists say the significant thing about the market last week was that it once again balked at penetrating into the area beyond the Feb. 4 high.

This is now a well-established "supply area," where selling is encountered at the relatively high prices prevailing on that date when the AP average reached \$165.

The market came close to that peak Monday when the AP average reached \$164.60.

The decisive action came Tuesday when the market backed down, taking a moderate loss.

The balance of the week was drab. Coppers backtracked despite a continuation of good news about higher prices.

The market was shocked Thursday by news that the big Canadian producer, Aluminium Ltd., had cut the price of aluminium.

This squelched a modest recovery trend as the aluminiums and other metal stocks tumbled and brought other issues down with them.

Alcoa and other American producers announced price cuts the next day. Stocks in this group took a licking on the week. Losses included 2 points for Aluminium Ltd.

IN MEMORIAM

JEROME POWER The residents of Montague and vicinity were shocked and saddened to hear of the sudden death of Mr. Jerome Power on Friday, January 24th. The deceased, accompanied by Mrs. Power, was driving his car to St. Mary's Church to attend the funeral of a fellow parishioner when he was stricken with a heart attack. He was immediately taken to the Kings County Hospital a few yards distant where it was found

that he had passed away. Mr. Power, born at New Perth sixty-nine years ago, was the son of the late Terrance Power and Mary Ellen (Macdonald) Power. Early in life he assumed the responsibility of operating the home farm and caring for his parents. In 1931 he married Angelina Lannan, R.N. After a long period of successful farming he retired four years ago on the advice of his doctor and took up residence in Montague where he made many new friends and derived much pleasure from his varied activities. Only a few days before his death he and Mrs. Power arrived home from Boston and Toronto where they visited friends and relatives.

He was a devout member of the Catholic Church and took an active part in supporting church activities. He will be remembered for his loyalty and devotion to family and friends, his hospitality in the home, his friendly greeting, and his jovial disposition. The many Mass offerings, spiritual bouquets, messages of sympathy, and floral tributes received by the bereaved family gave evidence of the esteem in which he was held.

Besides his sorrowing widow he leaves to mourn one son Earl, and a daughter Margaret, Earl, John Fitzpatrick, both of whom reside in Toronto. Also surviving is a brother, John, of New Perth and two sisters, Catherine and Marnie, Mrs. Joseph McMillan, of Boston. A brother, William, who lived in New Glasgow, Nova Scotia, predeceased him a few years ago.

The largely attended funeral was held January 27th with Requiem High Mass celebrated by his pastor, Rev. J. W. McCordie, at St. Mary's Church, Montague. Also present in the sanctuary were Reverend O. Kiggins, Reverend E. O'Hanley, and Reverend J. A. Sullivan.

Interment was in the Church cemetery. The pall bearers were Messrs. James Cain, Duncan McIntyre, Raymond Fitzpatrick, Gordon Myers, Joseph Brothers, and John Callaghan.
