MURRAY HARBOR — One of the largest and busiest shipping seasons on record for this port closed with the return of MV C.A. Roland to the port on Sunday, Dec. 24.

The vessel returned from Newfoundland bringing her crew back to their homes in time for Christmas. The captain and engineer returned to their homes in Newfoundland Sunday afternoon by plane.

It may be recalled that on Dec. 22, 1960, the MV National Four left here with a cargo of farm produce for Newfoundland, setting a late date for the port's shipping season up to the present time.

The Roland is owned by C.M. Lea and Chessel Irving.

Castro Names Ambassador To Vatican

VATICAN CITY (AP) — Premier Fidel Castro has appointed a new ambassador to the Vatican in an apparent move to ease strained relations between his pro-Communist regime in Cuba and the Roman Catholic Church.

Castro's appointment of Luis Amado Blasco y Fernandez became known here with the routine publication of the 1962 directory of the diplomatic corps accredited to the Vatican.

An official at the Cuban embassy confirmed the appointment of Blasco y Fernandez, but said he had not yet arrived in Rome.

The previous Cuban envoy, Dr. Jose Ruiz Velasco, presented his credentials in March, 1960, but was recalled by Castro less than nine months later.

Castro's ouster of several Roman Catholic priests from Cuba led to further strain between the Vatican and Havana, and by last summer relations between the two appeared near the breaking point.

French Resistance Fighter Carves Career In Montreal

MONTREAL (CP) — A French German guard to hold her resistance fighter, who once escaped detention by asking a her shoe, today is a housewife.

Insurance broker and writer in suburban Montreal
When she first came to Canada as a widow, Reine Charrier, a medical doctor in France, worked as a maid. Later she became a reporter for a weekly newspaper, re-married and adopted three boys.
Awarded the Commemorative

Medal of 1950-51, the medal of the French Resistance and the French and Belgian Croix de Guerre for her war work. Mrs. Charrier recently published a book describing her experiences during those years.
She says she wrote Rescapes de l'Enfer-Nazi in longhand during the first 15 days of Au-

gust, working at night after the children were in bed.
The grey-haired woman recalled that she met and married her first husband when, at 20, she was engaged in espionage and helping those hunted by the Gestapo to escape from France.
Her own close call came when she was leaving a Ger-

man arsenal where she had photographed secret plans and heard the whistle of a patrol. Fishing desperately for a plan to avoid the almost inevitable search, she approached a German soldier and asked him to hold the bag containing the photographs while she tied her shoe.
She engaged him in conver-

sation, all the while edging them slowly past the patrol. Then she continued talking and laughing until she was safely out the gate.
