

# Suspended Term Is Given In Break

Appearing for sentence on a charge of breaking out, Emmett Bernard Blaquiere, Charlottetown, was given a two-year suspended sentence by Magistrate A. J. Haslam in city police court yesterday. In addition, he was ordered to enter into a recognizance in the amount of \$1,000, with two sureties of \$500 each.

Blaquiere was charged with breaking out of the Holloway Club, after having entered the building with the intent to commit an indictable offence. The accused was not represented by counsel.

**CHARGE OF THEFT**  
James Garry Gormley, Charlottetown, also unrepresented, elected trial by magistrate, on a charge of theft, and was remanded in custody until July 27 for preliminary hearing.

The accused is charged with the theft of goods from a salesman's automobile, valued at over \$50, the property of Beaumont Wholesale Dry Goods Ltd., Queen Street.

On a second charge, of vagrancy, Gormley was also remanded until the same date. Of three persons who pleaded guilty to being drunk and incapable, one was given a 20-day suspended sentence, another received 10 days in Queens County Jail, and the third was fined \$10 and costs or five days.
