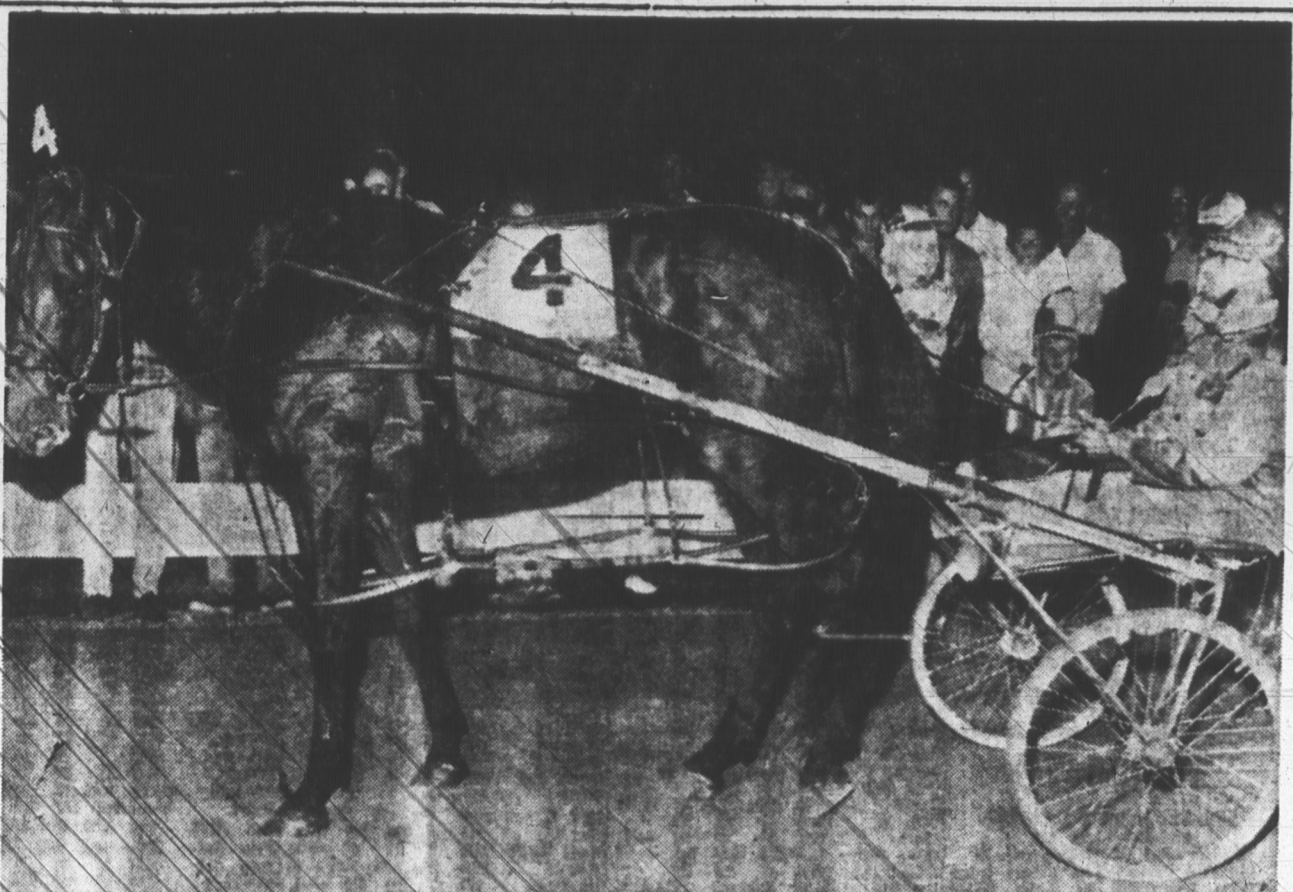

Migratory Bird Season Generally Satisfactory

The Migratory Bird Season, recently announced, have met with general approval on the whole. Ducks, other than black ducks—and geese, October 1st to November 30th. The grave black duck situation resulted in a fifteen day breather for this prized duck, October 15th to November 30th. If the close season on black ducks until October 15th is observed and, according to information received, it had better be, the take should be light.

P.E.I.'s black duck season looks pretty tame when compared to the sister provinces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. P.E.I. October 15th to November 30th. Nova Scotia has three seasons that cover the province's different sections. (1) Cumberland, Colchester, Pictou, Antigonish, Hants, Kings and Annapolis Counties—October 25 to December 9. (2) Guysborough, Halifax, Lunenburg, Queens, Digby, Shelburne and Yarmouth Counties—November 23 to January 15. (3) Inverness, Victoria, Cape Breton and Richmond Counties, October 25 to October 31, and December 1 to January 1. It is quite apparent that the season dates are set not for the benefit of our fast vanishing black ducks but to give the hunting fraternity an opportunity to bag every black duck possible.
