NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market held to a new historic peak Tuesday in the liveliest session since the start of the Chrysler, General Motors, Koro—both the regular and wheel-and-hub—stock and assorted blue chips throughout the list gained importance.

The rally came after seven straight sessions of confused, mostly trendless trading days. Some brokers hailed it as the start of the "traditional year-end rally" but the margin of gains over losers in the overall list was not large.

Enough of the pivotal blue chips advanced to give all the popular markets barometer a healthy gain and record high readings.

The Dow Jones Industrial average rose 4.74 to 766.38, topping the previous record of 765.44 set in 1956.

Standard and Poor's 500-stock index rose 4.4 to 74.74, bettering the previous high of 74.88 set Oct. 28.

AP Average Up: The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 1.5 to a new high of 264.7, topping its previous high of 263.5 made also on Dec. 8.

An estimated \$2,300,000,000 of stocks listed on the New York Stock Exchange, based on the rise in the AP average, was the sharpest gain since Nov. 19 when the AP average rose 2.4.

Volume swelled to 5,250,000 shares from 4,800,000 on Monday and was the largest since Nov. 9 when a 9,200,000 share change had the AP average change hands.

As trading began in Xerox when-issued stock, based on the widespread stock spill, these issues soared and the market atmosphere became more heated.

Traders said they expected Xerox regular common to be traded on a when-issued basis for some time.

Xerox regular common rose up 34 1/2 points to 41 1/2 and its when-issued stock, which was trading at 7 1/4, closed at 8 3/4 for a gain of 6 1/4 on the day.

Xerox when-issued was the most active stock on 173,000 shares. Xerox regular common was sixth most active on 50,700 shares.

Spencer Rand, in continued demand, was second most active, up 1 1/2 to 20 1/2 on 17,000 shares. Chrysler was third, rising 3/8 to 9 1/4 on 12,000 shares.
