

# U of T Campus Safety Questioned

TORONTO (CUP) — The assault on a University of Toronto policewoman last month has questions about protection of campus security staff.

Officer Judith Niles was shoved through the plate glass window of a campus building on Aug. 2 when she refused to let a student and her husband enter a campus building. She

suffered a dislocated shoulder and cuts requiring 25 stitches.

Niles first refused entry to a U of T student who did not have proper identification for admittance to the building. The student returned with her husband and was again refused entry. The man refused to leave, and a scuffle ensued, in which the man allegedly punched Niles twice, sending her through a half-inch-thick glass window.

According to witnesses, he continued the altercation outside the building until he was restrained. The men left the campus, and reported the incident to police himself.

"He reported he had been assaulted by Niles but according to our information that did not happen," said a Metro police officer. "I arrested him and charged him with assaulting a police officer. What we had was a serious assault causing bodily harm. Certainly the officer's life was in danger. She was in a great deal of pain when I spoke with her."

Security personnel on most campuses are not armed. "We are instructed to call Metro police in the event of an emergency," said another U of T police officer. "But that doesn't do us any good if we're facing a guy with a knife or a gun, and it certainly didn't help officer Niles."

## Mathematical Comments

1. A triangle can be drawn only if the sides are measured in the same unit or in some dimensionless unit. It would be difficult to measure intimacy, passion and commitment in the same unit or in some dimensionless unit. The love triangles drawn by an individual would often be too subjective, and a comparison of different persons' love triangles would then become impractical.

2. There is a contradiction in Sternberg's love triangle theory. A triangle with two fixed, equal sides had the largest area when the triangle is equilateral. For example, if a love triangle has fixed, equal amounts of passion and intimacy, and if the length of commitment is increased, the area of the triangle decreases. Thus, the amount of love decreases according to Sternberg contrary to common sense.

3. In fact, if intimacy, passion, and commitment could be measured in dimensionless units, it would be more logical to use the perimeter of the triangle to represent the amount of love. But even this has an unnecessary restriction, such as the length of one side must be less than the sum of the lengths of the other two sides. Instead, it would make more sense to express the amount of love (L) as a linear or quadratic sum of intimacy (I), passion (P), and commitment (C). Symbolically we can write

$$L = I + C + P,$$

or  $L = I^2 + C^2 + P^2$ . However, the validity of a "love" formula should be determined empirically.

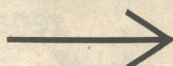
