IN MEMORIAM

MATHIAS KOUGHAN

It was with a feeling of deep regret to learn of the sudden death of Mathias Koughan, son of Mrs. Koughan and the late Martin Koughan of Donagh, which occurred in the City Hospital on October 7, in his 57th year.
In the passing of Mr. Koughan, the district of Donagh has lost a valuable neighbor, being of a kind, charitable and obliging nature. This, coupled with his great ability to perform any job, will leave a vacancy which will be difficult to fill.

But it is in the home where his presence will be missed the most, because he could always be found there, attending and directing the many details that are common to family life.
Some 30 years ago, he married Miss Catherine MacDonald, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Norman MacDonald of Webster's Corner, and settled down to farm life and although they raised a large family, through their hard work, thriftiness and careful management, they succeeded in providing themselves with a comfortable home.

He was a devout member of the Catholic Church, receiving the Last Sacred Rites a short time previous to his death, and was visited frequently by his pastor, Rev. T. P. Butler.
His funeral to St. Patrick's Church, Fort Augustus, which was held on October 9 was largely attended. A solemn Requiem High Mass was celebrated by the pastor, Rev. T. P. Butler, assisted by Rev. A. J. McLeod as deacon and Rev. Vincent Murnaghan as sub-deacon. Present in the sanctuary were Rev. Allan MacDonald and Rev. W. O. Simpson.
Services at the grave were performed by Rev. T. P. Butler.

Rita at home. Also four sons, William in Charlottetown, Norman, Victor and James in Donagh. He is survived also by his aged mother in the Sacred Heart Home, Charlottetown. One brother, Francis in Donagh and one sister (Laura) Mrs. Joseph Holland, Tarantum. One brother and three sisters pre-deceased him.
