NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market crawled through its most sluggish session in nearly two years Wednesday, ending with a moderate loss for the second straight day.
 Volume totalled 3,030,000 shares, the lightest since 2,940,000 changed hands Aug. 2, 1963. The Dow Jones average of 30 industrials declined 24 1/2 to 870.77.

The Associated Press 60 stock average dropped 4 to 320.0. Among Canadian issues, Dome Mines added 1/4 and Granby Mining & Aluminum Ltd. slipped 1/4. Canadian Pacific 1/4, Distillers Seagrams 1/2 and International Nickel 1/4.
 Prices declined on the American Stock Exchange, Brazilian Traction, Canadian Javelin and Security Rainbow Oil all gained 1/4. Fargo Oil 1/4 and Molybdenite 1/16. Preston sank 1/16.

MONTREAL (CP) — Stocks were lower Wednesday on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges. Trading continued to be moderate.
 Industrial volume was 151,300 shares, and mines and oils 1,011,400.
 The composite index was off 1.5 at 151.7.
 Industrials were off 1.6 at 166.8.
 Utilities were off 1.6 at 147.6.
 Bell Telephone was up 1/4 at 58 1/2 and Brinco added 1/4 to 6 1/2.
 Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce dropped 1/4 points to 65.
 Machinery issues eased with CAE down 1/4 to 12 1/2 and Massey-Ferguson 1/4 to 29 1/2.

TORONTO (CP) — The main list took losses for the second consecutive day this week in a lock exchange dealings.
 Losses were mainly fractional, but some issues had drops of a point or more.
 Among industrials, Dofoaco and MacMillan-Bloedel each trimmed 1/4 to 26 1/2 and 30 while CPR fell 1/4 to 61 1/2 and Texaco 1/4 to 49 1/2.
 On index, Industrials fell 1.67 to 162.15, Toronto Stock Exchange index 1.49 to 152.30, base metals 1/4 to 75.55 and western oils 1.06 to 97.80. Gold rose 2.36 to 163.03.

Car Production Figures Given
TORONTO (CP) — Canadian car makers have scheduled 15,265 cars to roll off assembly lines in the week ended July 10, the Motor Vehicle Manufacturers' Association says.
 This compares with 11,957 cars produced last week. Studebaker, closed for the summer to build models, has scheduled no production this week.
 Total cars produced to July 3 was 403,180, compared with 369,774 produced at the same time last year. Truck production was 79,319, compared with 66,988 at the same time last year.
 Production last week was slowed by the four-day work week. Only 14,593 cars and trucks were produced. Production target this week is 18,104 cars and trucks.
