

IN MEMORIAM

MR. MICHAEL GREENAN

Friends throughout the Province learned with regret of the passing of Michael Greenan of the Kinkora, on June 14th, at the Charlottetown Hospital, after a brief illness.

Born in Newton in 1866 the late Mr. Greenan (with the exception of a few years spent in Western Canada) was a life long resident of Kinkora parish, where by his industry, he established a home, which was the centre of an ideal Christian family life.

His life had seen its share of joy and sorrow, the loss of his dearly beloved wife at an early age was a great sorrow to him, but through all his trust in God, and his charity to all continued to develop and grow stronger.

His declining years were made happy by the kindness of his family, and strength of soul given by the spiritual consolations imparted by the Rev. Maurice MacDonald, City Hospital. He met death with perfect resignation to the Divine will, knowing it to be the gateway to a happy eternity.

His remains were conveyed from the home of his son Clair, Park St., Charlottetown June 15, to Kinkora, from where a largely attended funeral was held Tuesday morning to St. Malachi's Church, Kinkora.

Funeral Mass was celebrated by the pastor, Rev. Claude Sheehy, assisted by Rev. Reginald MacDonald, Seven Mile Bay.

MOOSE JAW, (CP)—FO. James Marvin, DFC, of Kentville, N. S., was identified Friday as the airman critically injured early Thursday when two Harvard training planes collided on a runway here.

FO. Marvin, an instructor at the Nato training school here, was in the rear cockpit of a training plane taxiing on the runway, the RCAF said. A second plane crashed into the side of the first Harvard.

Sentenced To Five Years

BELSEN, Germany, (AP)—Gnr. Thomas Dwyer, 22, of Boyd's Cove, Nfld., was sentenced Friday to five years imprisonment by a Canadian martial court for the fatal beating June 10 of a Polish displaced person.

Dwyer, attached to the 27th Canadian infantry brigade, was found guilty of a manslaughter charge by a court presided over by Brig. M. P. Bogard of Ottawa, flown here to sit at the trial.

Participated In Theft of Jewelry

MONTREAL (CP)—Daneilo Bregant, 20, a new Canadian, testified in court Thursday that he and three others stole jewelry worth \$27,000 in a burglary at the European-Canadian Trading Company July 15.

The testimony came at an all-day preliminary hearing before Judge Guy Gibault in which Bernard Randolph was charged with being one of the four involved. Bregant named two others, who have not yet been arrested, as Henry Engel and Mikie Walsh, af-

Britain Retains Freedom Of Action In Peace Talks

LONDON (Reuters)—Clement Attlee charged Thursday that the United States had announced its attitude toward Korean peace talks without taking account of the views of its allies.

The Labor party leader asked the government to make clear that Britain cannot subscribe to "these narrow policies".

Acting Prime Minister R. A. Butler replied that Britain has advised the U. S. it retains complete freedom of action if there is any breakdown in the Korean armistice.

Britain, he said, is "in no way committed" in advance to any action which might result from a South Korean breach of truce, renewed Communist aggression, or an American walkout from the political conference.

Labor party MPs and peers expressed concern over two statements attributed to U. S. state secretary John Foster Dulles at a Washington press conference Tuesday. They were:

1. That he would be opposed to the admission of Communist China to the United Nations as the price for unification of Korea.

2. That the U. S. would walk out of the political conference after 90 days if it felt the Communists were negotiating in bad faith.

Butler said that after reading reports of the Dulles press conference, the government had asked Washington for "certain clarifications."
