BUYING BY GRADE Mr. Smith MacFarlane, inspector of canned goods, told the audience they should always buy by grade. He mentioned special sales held frequently and pointed out that frequently the articles were of lower grade than the consumer was accustomed to getting. He said there are four standards for canned goods in this country. They are fancy, choice, standard and sub-standard, but very often the difference in price between the two top grades represented nothing more than a charge for sizing the vegetables. Regarding jam he said there were two grades, Number 1 which is pure jam, and Number 2 to which something has been added. So far as preserves are concerned only Number 1 is allowed to be sold.
