JERUSALEM (AP) — New shooting was reported on Israel's borders with Jordan and Syria Sunday.

As border tensions increased, Jordan demanded the removal of U.S. Marine Colonel Byron Leary as the UN truce observer.

In an announcement that Leary is taking its latest border dispute with Israel to the UN Security Council, the Arab government said it no longer will cooperate with Leary and that it will not consider his decision binding on Jordan.

Israel already boycotts the mixed armistice commission headed by Leary. The Jordanian demand for his removal brought about the possibility Jordan too would boycott the commission.
