Hypnosis Plays Role in Patient Recovery

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — A despairing patient may find relief in hypnosis, a doctor here reminded that someone depends on him for motivation far stronger than personal considerations, says a San Francisco surgeon.

New techniques of hypnosis can open this path to recovery with ordinary means of communication, says Dr. David Cheek, gynecologist and staff surgeon of three of the city's leading hospitals.

Dr. Cheek preaches and teaches hypnosis. He has used it with patients for almost 20 years. "We know that a shift from despair to hope may bring about an amazing shift from illness to health under many circumstances but we have not explored adequately the subconscious mechanisms responsible for it," Dr. Cheek says.

MEANING WORK
The unresponsive subconscious can attach wrong meanings, Dr. Cheek points out. A surgeon's "it's over now" may mean the operation is completed. But an anxious cancer patient may think the surgeon means he is dying. He may despair and die.
