Eden's reply, which was drafted in consultation with Britain's 14 Atlantic pact allies, was handed over in Moscow Monday.

Cabin Cruiser Has Rough Trip

OTTAWA (CP) — A 34-foot cabin cruiser manned by a crew of three anchored Tuesday at the Chateau locks in the Rideau canal after a gruelling 1,000-mile voyage from Halifax.

The cruiser, the Tarpon II from the Armadae Yacht Club, Halifax, was skippered by Warrant Officer Harry Lewis, who has been transferred to RCAF headquarters in the capital.

He and his wife, Jo, left Halifax June 14 on the trip to Ottawa. They plan to live on the cruiser until the winter and to make a trip around the Thousand Islands next summer.

Navigator for the voyage was Sgt. Bruce Dexter of the RCAF station at Greenwood, N.S., a former RCAF pilot. He used his holidays to make the trip and plans to return to Greenwood.

Dexter is the son of Mrs. Anna Dexter, well-known Halifax radio personality.

During the trip along the Gaspe coast the cruiser was buffeted by winds of near-hurricane force. One night the vessel was forced to seek the shelter of Miscou Island.

"I wouldn't make that trip again for all the money in the world," said Mrs. Lewis.

She said the weather was so bad in Northumberland Strait that experienced fishermen remained in port.

The Communist government still controlled the press and the flow of news in satellite countries and in Europe. Recent uprisings and demonstrations in Poland and in Czechoslovakia were proof that the people are not deceived, that they want more than promises.

The European newspaper men addressed the convention after David Lewis, national chairman of the GCF, spoke on the expanding role of the labor movement.

Mr. Lewis said the task of labor in the next 25 years would be more difficult than in the past and that the white collar worker must play a greater role than before.

He referred to the task labor will face to avoid dislocation of the thousands of persons who will be replaced by automation and of the international struggle between forces seeking a world of law and freedom and nations seeking world domination.

He said organization of workers is "an absolute must." Without it, and the influence of these workers, labor would not be able to exert the influence it must "if we are to avoid the dislocation and suffering of the past."

WASHINGTON (AP) — Gen. Nathan F. Twining, U.S. Air Force chief of staff, warned Tuesday that Russia may give the West a "technological surprise in new weapons."

While he got only a glimpse of Soviet air power on his recent visit to Russia, Twining told the Senate armed services committee, it was enough to put him on his guard.

"I feel that our visit substantially strengthened our previous assessments that the U.S.S.R., while certainly not abreast of us today, can and is progressively narrowing the technological lead of the West generally and of the United States in particular," he said.

The air force chief reported the Russians are putting emphasis on the thorough training of carefully selected personnel, squeezing the maximum potential from a jet
