

Rural Minor Hockey Night Set For Tonight At SDU

The first of what is planned to be an annual event will be held off at the St. Dunstan's University rink tonight when the Rural Minor Hockey Association stage their first Minor Hockey Night.

This association was formed in the fall of this year when the parents of children in the rural areas of Sherwood, Parkdale, Bantam, Southport and other nearby areas learned that their children would be excluded from the paperweight minor hockey program in Charlottetown this winter.

A meeting for all interested parents was called and the response was such that an executive was formed at this first meeting and the Rural Minor Hockey Association was on its way.

At this time the association had no rink facilities or no money, but they planned to find some means to have their youngsters enjoy minor hockey.

The executive elected at the first meeting included: Willis Hennessey, president; Wilfred Constable, vice-president; Dr. Jim Higgins, secretary; and Peter Sullivan, treasurer.

The executive then went about the business of finding a place for their prospective program and were able to obtain ice time at St. Dunstan's University rink, approximately four hours ice time per week.

At the beginning this committee had planned to form a paperweight league only, but when they found they could obtain sufficient time they decided to expand their plans to include the Pee Wee and Bantam divisions.

At the present time, the rural association has approximately 200 youngsters in all three divisions with the majority of these in the paperweight division.

The Pee Wee and Bantam players have been put in a type of house league due to the fact they didn't have enough competition to warrant two separate leagues.

The association has obtained the services of Joe Coyle as referee in chief for their association and Ken MacDonald takes

care of the stationer's duties. Officials scheduled to be on hand at the SDU rink for Tuesday night's program will include: Lt. Governor W.J. MacDonald; David M. Boswell, provincial director of physical education; Brig. W.W. Reid, Rev. George MacDonald, rector St. Dunstan's University and Rev. Ross Howard, Sherwood.

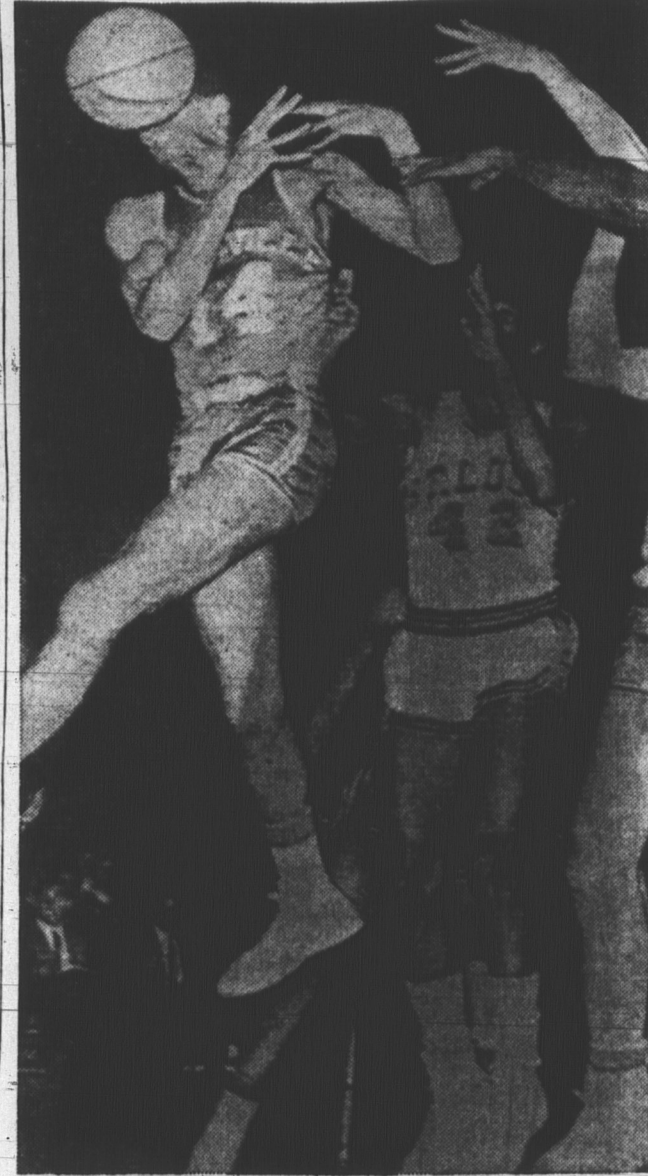
