

MINISTER EXPLAINS

Small Amount Of Frozen Food Is Dumped At New Annan Plant

On a question of privilege in the Legislature yesterday, Agriculture Minister Andrew MacRae gave an explanation of why a small quantity of frozen cauliflower and potato chips were dumped recently by the New Annan food processing plant.

He said he had been advised by the company that due to a malfunction in a production line a small percentage under process was spoiled and had to be dumped.

Given third reading during the morning, the bill enables the provincial government to enter into an agreement with the federal government on the Canada Pension Plan.

18 Canadians Feared Dead In Tokyo CPA Jet Crash

TOKYO (CP-AP)—A Canadian Pacific Airlines jetliner groping for a landing in fog hit the approach lights at Tokyo's International Airport Friday night and smashed down in flames, killing 64 persons, many of them Canadian residents.

Only eight persons were known to have survived the crash, at least three of them with Canadian addresses.

At least 21 Canadian residents were listed aboard the flight and most of them were presumed killed.
