News Notes.

Cholera is raging in Chili. Gold premium at Buenos Ayres, 325 per cent. Horseflesh in Germany is now nearly as costly as beef.

The issue of all rye bread to the German army has been resumed. There has been a rise of five shillings on corn in Liverpool since Saturday.

The British Government has decided not to call an autumn session of parliament. The cantatrice Wilt, who recently committed suicide at Vienna, left \$200,000, mostly to charities.

It is persistently rumored that Captain Younghusband has been killed by the Russians at Pamir. The latest news from Norway is to the effect that King Oscar will use force, if necessary, to prevent the threatened disunion of Sweden and Norway.

It is reported that Archduke Carl Ludwig, who, upon the death of Crown Prince Rudolph, became heir-presumptive to the crown of Austria-Hungary, is about to resign his heirship in favor of his son, Archduke Franz.

The sale of the Moscow Gazette has been stopped by the press censors on account of an article accusing M. Vishnegradski, Minister of Finance, of an unpatriotic leaning toward Germany in attempting to negotiate a commercial treaty with that country.

A recent experiment at Eastbourne, in the south of England has attracted the attention of the press all over the country, and it is not without interest. The Salvation Army parades had so excited an irreligious portion of the local population that the latter saw in them an incentive to violence. Several riots occurred after police interference had been called in to keep the streets clear. The question was solved by the issuance of a proclamation signed by the mayor of the town declaring that no procession accompanied by instrumental music would be allowed to pass through the streets. The proclamation had the desired effect.

At the Fisheries Department it is learned that the British Columbia salmon pack this year will not aggregate much more than 300,000 cases. This is a considerable decrease as compared with 1889 and 1890, but away above the average pack of the last decade. The progress of the industry is indicated by the statement of the number of cases packed in the province during the last ten years:

One of the last and best things that Parliament has done this session was to pass an address to the Queen asking for imperial legislation confirming the Canadian Copyright Act of 1889. This act provides that the British publisher may copyright his work in Canada, but if he fails to publish it here within one month after its publication elsewhere any person domiciled in Canada may obtain a license, but not an exclusive right to publish it on condition of paying a royalty of 10 per cent. of the retail price to the author. This is an eminently fair enactment; it gives the British author or publisher every privilege except that of playing dog in the manger. It gives him, for a month, the exclusive right of publication here; if he does not choose to avail himself of that right, it secures to him the usual royalty of 10 per cent. of the retail price of the book. If the address shall fall the best thing the Parliament of Canada can do is to put its own legislation into force, and let the British publisher do the petitioning and protesting.
