Dr. Gould's Great Work.

Power Exerted on a Bicycle.

Some recent results of tests made by Professor Carpenter of Cornell to determine the power required to drive bicycles may be of more interest to electrical engineers if reduced to their familiar unit of power, the watt. These tests show that for a speed of five miles an hour on a good level road the rider works at the rate of about 19 watts, which is about one-third the power used in ordinary 16 candle power incandescent lamp. At ten miles an hour the power applied by the rider is about 80 watts, and for hard, continuous riding 100. For a short period a good rider can work at the rate of about 250 watts. Every lighted incandescent lamp therefore consumes about the same amount of power as that developed by three bicycle riders under the ordinary conditions, while it is possible for a rider to expend about as much power as is required for about five of these lamps.—Electrical Engineer.
