

TIMELY NOTES ON FUR TOPICS

The Canadian fur dressing industry is big business. In 1955 the number of skins treated was 9,279,887 and the cost for the treatment of these furs was 5,634,991. Both domestic and imported skins were processed. Muskrat, squirrel, mink and Persian lamb skins accounted for over 85 per cent of the total number of skins dressed and dyed. Salaries and wages for employees totalled \$3,000,111. Among the skins treated and the number were: badger, 1,004; bear, 882; beaver, 108,435; ermine, 40,000; fisher, 91; fox, silver, 1,767; other than silver, 1,079; kolinsky, 78,196; Persian lamb, 583,879; marten, 9,441; mink, 712,822; muskrat, 4,484,074.

An end of the season sale of EMBA and independent shippers' mutation mink at New York Auction Company last week continued the very strong price trend seen in the market recently. The collection was a very ordinary one except for the ceruleans, which were particularly strong. The collection of about 8,000 skins at about 95 per cent. Highest on the standards were \$61 for males and \$30 for females. Stewart's brought \$62 for males and \$30 for females while ceruleans brought \$66 for males and \$30.50 for females.

The offering of 5,855 standard autumn haze Stewart's were 95 per cent sold bringing highs of \$41.50 for males and \$23 for females. An offering of 26 topax skins was 95 per cent sold with a high of \$28.50 for males and \$14.25 for females. The 547 gummets were 85 per cent sold with highs of \$56 for males and \$36 for females.
