MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP) — Little trend was evident at the close of moderate trading on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Friday.
Miscellaneous stocks showed a weak tendency as Canadian Westinghouse slid 1 1/2 points to 48 1/2. Dips of 1/4 were taken by Dominion Glass at 73 1/2, Weston A at 30 1/2 and Canada and Dominion Sugar at 24. But Ford A gained 2 points at 84 and Weston B was up 1/4 at 28 1/2.
Utilities and beverages were mixed narrowly and changes ranged from one-point gains by Calgary power at 70 and Jamaica at 33 to 1/2-point losses by Galtineau at 33 1/2 and Seagraves at 28.
Toronto-Dominion Bank, down one point at 3 1/4, was the weak spot in firm bank, oil and pipeline and base metal groups. No-trends gained 1/4 at 43 1/4. Hudson Bay at 45 1/2 and Imperial Oil at 4 1/4 were up 1/4 each.
Canada Steamship Lines lost 1/4 to 30.
The senior mines and oils group was fractionally easier but the feature was Home Oil A up 1 1/2 at 19 1/2.
The penny section was mostly down.
The closing averages show banks up 0.25 at 50.76, utilities off 0.6 at 139.9, industrials up 0.2 at 261.0, combined off 0.1 at 220.6, papers up 0.5 at 368.6 and golds up 0.85 at 73.25.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market made it three straight on the upside Friday and advanced enough to put the average ahead slightly for the week.
Turnover was active most of the session. Once again, the rise was irregular so far as pivotal issues are concerned. Lower-priced stocks continued Thursday's role in dominating the list of favorites.
Aluminums slumped as a group on news that the Senate interior committee had rejected proposals for stockpiling that metal as well as lead and zinc.
The market was higher from the start. A succession of big paper stocks was traded. Some of the 200 and 300,000 shares. Trading proceeded at a brisk pace until afternoon when the pace

slowly considerably.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 70 cents to \$174.30 with the industrials up \$1.00, the rails up 40 cents and the utilities up 20 cents.
Among Canadian issues traded, Aluminum Ltd. was down 1/4, International Nickel gained 1/4, Hudson Bay Mining was up 1/4.
In the Canadian list on the American exchange Molybdenite and Preston East Dome were up 1-16. Fargo Oils added 1/4 and Scripps-Rainbow was up 1-16.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) — Base metals rallied near the close Friday to help pull the stock market to an irregular advance amid heavier trading.
Throughout most of the session, trading was dull but near the close a few low-priced metals pushed the volume to its highest in more than a week. Sales totaled 2,903,000 shares compared with Thursday's 2,446,000.
Senior base metals, led by Hudson Bay and International Nickel, moved up in a fractional range but low-priced metals were irregular. Faraday Uranium featured closing trading, dropping to 97 cents before rallying back to \$1.10, a loss of 19 cents. International Resnick, with a turnover of 355,000 shares, was the most active issue and it added 1/2 cent to 44 cents.
Western oils faded in late trading but changes were small and trading on most key issues light.
Index changes: Golds off 20 to 83.13; base metals up .57 to 156.79; Western oils off .12 to 134.28.
