LAST NIGHT'S BLAZE.—The fire last night was on the farm of Mr. Henry Hyde, at West River. As we can learn, the fire started in one of the barns shortly before 8 o'clock, from some cause unknown, and burned fiercely for several hours. Four barns were burned to the ground, with the whole of this season's crop, among which was 250 bushels of oats ready for market. With the assistance of some of the neighbors the farm stables and cattle were saved. The wind was blowing from the south, and had it been from the opposite direction the dwelling house would undoubtedly have been destroyed. Mr. Hyde's loss will be a heavy one, as the farm with the buildings was one of the finest in the Province. There is, we learn, no insurance. The smoke rolled in columns and the flames cast a lurid glare against the dark clouds, which was very visible in the city, giving many people the impression that the fire was within the city limits. Mr. Hyde intends rebuilding at once.

THE ALBERDEY.—The new cruiser Alberdeen, built in Scotland for the Dominion Government, arrived here from Pictou last night. While coming in the harbor she grounded at Murphy's Point, but floated off with the incoming tide, which caused a delay of about one hour. She has just finished supplying the lighthouse, and came in for a supply of water. The Alberdeen is 150 feet long, between perpendiculars, breadth, moulded 31 feet, depth of hold, moulded 16 feet 6-10; draught, 12 feet. She is lighted throughout by electricity and also carries a powerful search light. The engines are quadruple expansion, maintaining a speed of 12 knots. She has all the latest improvements, and cost \$56,586. She is commanded by Captain Knowlton, late of the Vigilant, with Mr. Meikle, late of the Land Rover, first officer, and Mr. Ferguson, late second engineer of the Stanley, chief engineer, with four firemen. The new boat is intended for the fishery protection service, for which she leaves here to-morrow.
