Steel Strike Affects Hunt

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—A brief steel strike in Hamilton earlier this summer is apparently being reflected on—of all things—the partridge hunt in Newfoundland.
In an attempt to regulate accurately and ascertain the kill this year, wildlife authorities had planned to issue 30 metal tags to resident partridge hunters purchasing \$2 licenses.
But the steel strike apparently delayed delivery of the

tags and the whole idea was to be re-introduced next fall.
The 50-bird limit for ptarmigan—known in Newfoundland as partridges—will still be in effect this season which opens Sept. 19 and continues until Nov. 30. The daily bag limit is eight and the possession limit 16.
The province's big game hunting season opened in some areas Monday. Bag limit for Moose, Caribou and bear is one animal per license.
