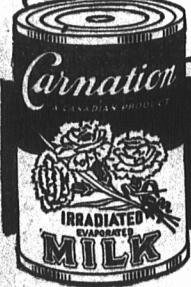

CREAMED SHRIMPS AND PEAS IN BREAD BASKET

CANADA WEST INDIES TRADE

Discussing the pending revision of the Canada-West Indies Trade Agreement, "Canada Weekly" says that at least 90 per cent of responsible people in the British Empire may have felt that they suffer some hardships, or at least that others were receiving greater benefits. Some Colonies benefited more than others. It would not be humanly possible to make a comprehensive agreement that would be equally satisfactory to all.

In 1938 the trade balance in favour of the West Indies was only \$3,000,000. Also it is pointed out that the 2,000,000 people in the British West Indies and British Guiana are purchasing Canadian products at the rate of \$4.23 per capita, whereas the 10,000,000 people in Canada are only buying West Indian products to the extent of \$1.63 per head. Furthermore, the average purchasing power of the inhabitants of the West Indies is, of course, far lower than that of Canadians.

Both these arguments can undoubtedly be picked to pieces. For instance, geographically, only a portion of the 10,000,000 in Canada are even potential purchasers of West Indian products. On the other hand, there are Canadian banks, insurance companies and other financial institutions doing a profitable business in the West Indies and the islands are enjoying valuable tourist trade with Canada, thanks, in a very large measure, to the Canadian National Steamships service.
