

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. RODERICK J. MacPHEE

The vicinity of Selkirk was saddened on Friday morning, June 25, when it became known that one of its oldest and most respected citizens, Mrs. Roderick MacPhee, had passed away, at the advanced age of 94.

The deceased was a daughter of the late John Kelly, and Margaret MacLellan, and was born at Byrne's Road. When a child she moved with her parents to Bear River. At an early age she married the late Roderick MacPhee, who predeceased her 40 years ago. She spent her entire life at Selkirk. After her husband's death she lived in the old home, with her son, John L. MacPhee, and indeed hers was a life of comfort, being tenderly cared for by her son and daughter-in-law and her two grandchildren. Despite her grand old age, Mrs. MacPhee was active and blessed with all her faculties until the last.

Endowed with ardent Catholic faith, she spent the most part of her last years in prayer and preparation for her Heavenly Home and like all good Christians deserves the final announcement from God, "Well Done thou good and faithful Servant."

In her home she was a devoted mother and as a neighbour. Her memory will be a lasting one. She was always ready to help the sick and comfort the disconsolate. She leaves to mourn three daughters and five sons: Mrs. Paul MacKinnon and Mrs. Andrew MacLaren, Goose River; Mrs. Chester MacDonald, Clear Springs; Joseph and Ronald MacPhee, New York; John L. and Hugh MacPhee, Selkirk; Mell MacPhee, Monticello. Two sons: Donald J. and Walter predeceased her. She also is mourned by one sister, Mrs. John MacDonald, Bear River, and two brothers, Charles Kelly, Bear River and James Kelly, Boston.

These together with 41 grandchildren and 40 grand-grandchildren will always hold a loving remembrance of her kindness and sincerity.

Her funeral took place on Monday, June 28, at St. Margaret's Church. Requiem High Mass was sung by her pastor, Rev. George MacDonald, who also performed the service at the grave. Her large funeral procession, the numerous Mass Cards and messages of sympathy received testify that she was loved and respected by all who had known her. Her funeral was under the direction of Dingwell Bros., Souris, and her Pallbearers were five grandsons: Joseph, Roddie and Gerald MacPhee, Gus and Hubert MacLaren, and a nephew, Peter Kelly. There, in St. Margaret's Cemetery, beside her husband, she was laid to rest to await a glorious resurrection.

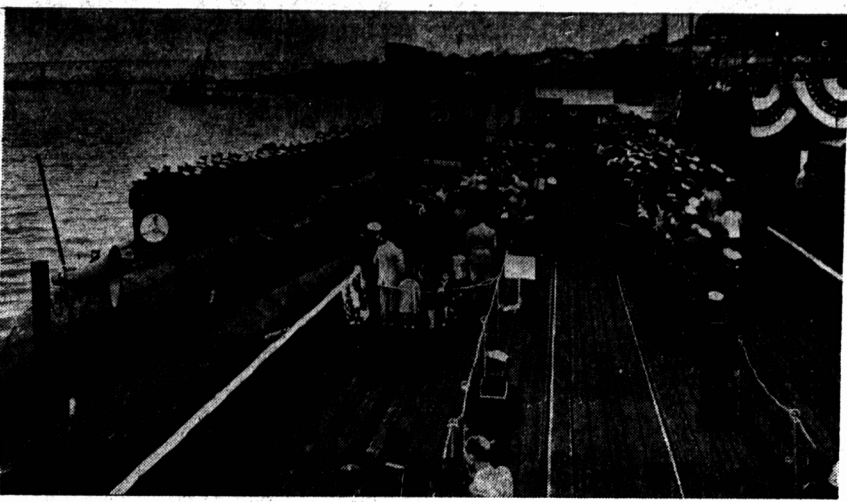
SPECIAL CEREMONY
