RESEARCH Continued from page 1 long ago in Lake Ontario and, the report said, should be capable of going down farther and staying down longer than human divers.

Other Activities The report gave the layman little inkling of what is going on, but these were among the brief clues: 1. Expansion of the mechanical engineering laboratories is necessary to keep pace with the "pressing demands" of the forces and industry, "demands which have in the case of the main and tunnel necessitated operation on a two-shift basis."
