**Local and Other Items**

**MAINE'S LOBSTER CATCH.**—The average annual catch of lobsters from the Maine coast is about 7,500,000, estimated to be worth \$750,000.—Bangor Paper.

**PRICE OF POTATOES.**—Nova Scotia shippers of potatoes to Havana have received returns showing the gross receipts to have been \$5 per barrel. This gives a good margin for shippers.—Yarmouth News.

**SNOW IN ENGLAND.**—Heavy falls of snow have occurred in various parts of England. In Sheffield the storm is described as a blizzard, and in Manchester street railway traffic was badly crippled.

**THEY COME HIGH.**—There are three newspapers published in Dawson City, the Midnight Sun, 50c a copy; the Nugget, the same price; the Klondike Miner, a new publication, 25c a copy; the two first are semi-weekly, the last a weekly publication.

**A DISASTROUS QUARREL.**—Richard Houston, and F Baker had a quarrel in Toronto a few nights ago and proceeded to fight. Baker says he was getting the worst of it, and seizing an axe, in self defence, he hit Houston on the head with it, with the result that Houston may die. Houston said Baker's attack was without provocation on his part.

**NOVEL EFFECT OF ELECTROLYSIS.**—A curious state of things is said to have been observed in investigating the electrolysis of water pipes in Dayton Ohio. It was found that stones and pebbles near the pipes in some cases seem to have been electroplated with the metal of the pipe, which one of the experts believes has never been observed before.

**PLENTY OF APPLES.**—So far this season the Furness steamers have taken to Liverpool and London 100,000 barrels of Nova Scotia apples, all of which have been shipped by the farmers of Annapolis valley. This quantity is largely in excess of last year's shipments. Of the total quantity shipped, nearly eighty thousand were taken to London and about twenty thousand to Liverpool.

**IRELAND'S POPULATION.**—The quarterly returns of births, deaths and marriages in Ireland during the past three months has just been issued, 26,155 births and 17,214 deaths have been registered. This increase in the population of 8,941 is, however, overbalanced by the emigration in the same period from Ireland of 3,744 men and 5,464 women, which causes an actual decrease in the population of 267.

**A SERIOUS MISTAKE.**—By the mistake of a servant, the family of Dr A S Morrison of Chesterville, Ont, got a dose of arsenic a few days ago. Mrs Morrison, the two hired men and the servant herself were victims of the mistake. While preparing dinner, the servant mistook white arsenic which she found in a saucer, for flour, and mixed the poisonous ingredient with the gravy to thicken it. A few hours after the family had dined they were all taken seriously ill, and at latest accounts serious doubts were entertained as to their recovery.

**HOBSON'S EARNINGS.**—Lieut. Hobson has realized upon his heroism. The notoriety which his sinking of the Merrimac has given him has put a high market price upon magazine articles written by him. He has earned enough by his writings to pay off a mortgage of \$6,000 on his house in the South, where his parents live. That mortgage became very threatening about war time, and following the sinking of the Merrimac the foreclosure was announced, and a subscription started. Mr. Hobson, sr, refused public aid, and his son has paid the debt.

**LOTS OF WHEAT.**—There are over one million bushels of Western grain now at Owen Sound, and the Canadian Pacific Railway are running about six train loads a day out of that point, through to Montreal for export to the Old Country. On Saturday there were in the elevators at Owen Sound 800,000 bushels of grain there were 300,000 bushels in vessels at the dock, and 500,000 bushels are on the way from Chicago. Grain from the Canadian Northwest are being coming through in large quantities the past few days, and the traffic returns are expected to be more favorable this week on that account. The freight business on the Grand Trunk is exceptionally heavy at the present time. About twenty freight trains are being sent out daily from York eastward, each train being an average of twenty-five cars.

**PERFECT PETRIFICATION**

**Body of a Woman Buried Ten Years Ago Found to be Solid.**

WOODSTOCK, Ont, Nov. 25.—Caretaker Porter of the Episcopal cemetery here received instructions a day or two ago to remove a body which had been buried in the wrong plot by mistake to another spot in the cemetery. The burial took place ten years ago. When the earth was thrown out it was found that the casket had rotted to such an extent that it was impossible to raise it. An effort was made to do so, but the black box crumbled to pieces, leaving the interior of the coffin exposed to view. After ten years the grave digger expected to find nothing but bleached bones, and imagine his surprise to find a perfectly preserved corpse. The form and features were perfect, and even the skin had retained the wax-like color which death imparted years ago. On closer examination it was found that the process of petrification, or whatever it was set in. The body was as stiff as a board and heavier than an ordinary corpse. It was decided to raise the body without the casket, and with some difficulty it was lifted and placed upright in the grave. It was then raised out of its long resting place, a new casket procured, and the body re-interred in its proper plot.
