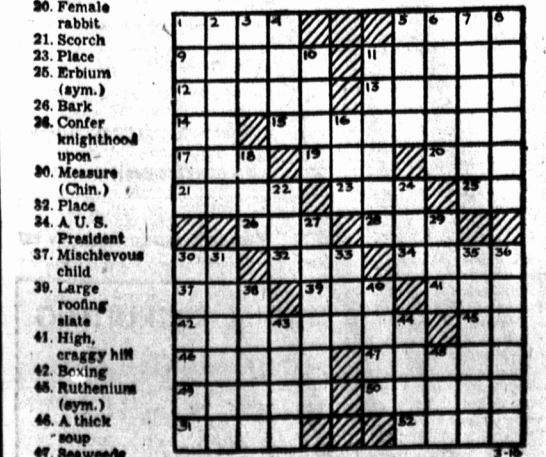

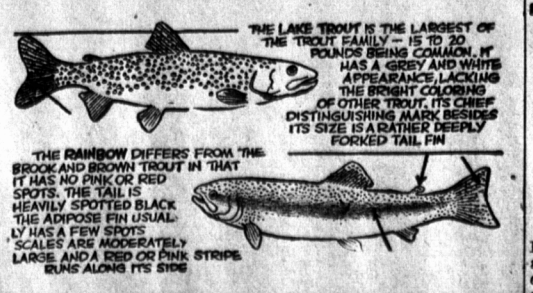
MEMBERS OF THE TROUT FAMILY ARE GREATLY SIMILAR IN GENERAL BODY FORM. HERE ARE SOME DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

THE BROOK TROUT HAS VERY SMALL SCALES, CLEAR PINK RED SPOTS, AND WHITE-EDGED LOWER FINS. ON THE BACK ARE WOVEN-LIKE MARKINGS. THE TAIL FIN IS ONLY SLIGHTLY FORKED AND THE MOUTH IS LARGE.

THE LAKE TROUT IS THE LARGEST OF THE TROUT FAMILY. IT IS TO 20 INCHES LONG. IT HAS A GREY AND WHITE APPEARANCE, LACKING THE BRIGHT COLORING OF OTHER TROUT. ITS CHIEF DISTINGUISHING MARK BESIDES ITS SIZE IS A BATTEREDLY FORKED TAIL FIN.

THE RAINBOW DIFFERS FROM THE BROOK AND LAKE TROUT IN THAT IT HAS NO PINK OR RED SPOTS. THE TAIL IS HEAVILY SPOTTED BLACK. THE TAIL FIN IS USUAL. IT HAS A FEW SPOTS. SCALES ARE MODERATELY LARGE AND A FEW PINK STRIPES RUN ALONG ITS SIDE.

DIFFUSE SPOTS BROWN OR PINK, MARK THE SIDES OF THE BROWN TROUT. THE ABOVE FIN IS ORANGE-BLUTCHED. THE TAIL HAS VERY FEW SPOTS AND IS OFTEN SPOTLESS. IT HAS LARGER SCALES THAN THOSE OF THE BROOK TROUT AND DARK SPOTS INSTEAD OF WAVEY DARK LINES ARE PRESENT ON THE BACK.
