## Abegweit Herd Cows Make Good Records

The Abegweit herd of the Estate J. Walter Jones, Bunbury has some outstanding achievements to its credit as recorded in the current issue of the Holstein-Friesian Journal.

Abegweit Sparkle has a three-year-old record of 15,321 lbs. milk, 664 pounds butter fat for an average test of 4.28 per cent to stand third in the current national listing for cows on two-times-a-day milking.

Abegweit Firefly was sixth in the mature class for twice-a-day milking with 15,478 pounds of milk, 754 pounds fat for an average test of 4.87. This was 181 per cent of the breed class average for butter fat and 137 per cent of the breed class average for milk production.

Abegweit Brilliant produced 16,995 lbs. milk, 679 lbs fat for an average test of 4 per cent.

Also in the same group for the Jones herd was Abegweit Signal with 16,348 pounds milk, 648

pounds fat for an average test of 3.96.

Charles S. MacDonald, Souris River had a cow, Renmark Kerk Doris, qualify with 15,023 pounds milk, 600 pounds butter fat for an average test of 3.99 per cent.

Abegweit Firefly is listed high in the Red Seal records for long-time production. She produced 115,732 pounds of milk, 5,564 lbs., of butter fat in seven lactations.

Firefly is sired by Abegweit Jack Pot and is a daughter of the famous Abegweit Stardust, a Very Good cow with up to 1317 pounds of butter fat and a 7 lactation total of 143,579 pounds of milk, 4.6 per cent fat, 6605 pounds butter fat.

Firefly has a 10-year 305 day record of 754 pounds fat on twice-a-day milking. She had been up to 929 lbs fat three-times-a-day milking. She has records of 874 and 847 pounds of fat on twice-a-day milking.

(Continued from Page One) The Soviet leader says have of-fended him. Khryshchev exploded angrily twice here Saturday when local leaders headed by Mayor Norris Poulsen challenged him to explain his past denunciations of American policies and life.

But Khryshchev appeared to have forgotten his angry outbursts as he sat aboard the train chatting animatedly with Russian aides and Henry Cabot Lodge, President Eisenhower's escort for him during his 12-day swing around the U. S.

Khryshchev was understood to believe that the questions hurled at him were unnecessarily provocative, deliberately designed to embarrass him while he was President Eisenhower's guest.

Mayor Poulsen denied his talk was aimed at needling the premier, but only at emphasizing to him that Americans wanted Soviet deeds to match Khryshchev's professions of peaceful intent.

Khryshchev was reported to have complained to one private American citizen: "Some persons just don't understand my mission to the United States."

A crowd estimated by police at 3,000 was on hand when the train stopped at Santa Barbara. Onlookers broke into enthusiastic applause and many waved when Khryshchev, smiling broadly, stepped off his private car.

Surrounded by security officers he walked from his train car to where Mayor Edward Abbott was waiting to greet him.

KEPT IN HOTELS Khryshchev said through his interpreter: "I did not get to see people during my stay in Los Angeles. They kept me in the hotel." Mayor Abbott then joked, "you can see the people here. Santa Barbara is a free city."

GANGSTER DIES LEVENWORTH Kan. (AP)—Frank Delmar, Kansas City gangster sentenced to 99 years in prison for robbing a bank in 1935, died in prison Saturday at the age of 58. In the intervening 23 years, associated warden Robert J. Kaiser said, Delmar never wrote a letter, never received one, never had a visitor. He had no known relatives.
